St Andrew's Walberswick News

In December we were granted a faculty to complete some long outstanding repair works to the fabric of the building. The most obvious of these works will be the redecoration of the porch. As soon as we enter warmer, dryer weather we hope to see this work completed. Hopefully the church will look brighter and more welcoming as a result.

The PCC has appointed an Architect, Nick Jacob from Ipswich, to prepare for us some plans for adapting the interior of the church, with a view to making the building more flexible. At present we have nowhere to provide any facilities for a Sunday School for children, and no means of easily and comfortably preparing and serving refreshments. We have asked Nick to look at these things and we look forward to seeing his ideas.

February 17th is Shrove Tuesday, or Pancake Day. The word shrove or shriven refers to the practice of confessing one's sins and of being assured of God's forgiveness. It was once common practice to be shriven on the day before entering the season of Lent, and thus being set free of any burden or anxiety of conscience while benefiting from a holy Lent. The eating of pancakes was associated with Shrove Tuesday, eating up all the lelt over luxury rich foods still in the cupboard in the form of a pancake, and then living a simpler lifestyle during Lent as we remember Christ's temptation in the wilderness.

We will enjoy pancakes in the Vicarage on Shrove Tuesday, but I might hold off on the chocolate sauce and the lemon and sugar, as I am still trying to shift the Christmas excess! Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 18th February. Ash Wednesday is so called because of the tradition that worshippers on this day receive the sign of the cross on their foreheads in ash, the ash being produced by burning the previous year's palm crosses. A few years ago I nearly burned down the Vicarage. I was burning a pile of palm crosses, but then the telephone rang. I was distracted, abandoning my garage based bonfire. When I returned the flames had spread beyond the metal tray I was using and the garage was filled with smoke. I had a great deal more ash to contend with than I had anticipated.

You are all welcome to join us at 10.00 on Ash Wednesday and to receive the sign of the cross. I wish you all a holy Lent, in Jesus name.

WALBERSWICK LUNCHEON CLUB

After careful consideration and with regret we have decided that we cannot continue to run the Luncheon Club. The Walberswick Lunch Club has been in existence almost 12 years serving a hot freshly cooked 2 course meal to anyone of any age in the village, their family, their carers and those with a close association with the village. Inspired by a vivid dream we started this venture, moved by our faith enabling people in the community to share a simple informal meal together; it has no formal association with the church, the PCC, or any other organisation.

The club is not a charity and is self- funding, the income from one meal being used to pay for the next. We have also budgeted for costs including hire of the VH, public liability insurance, food preparation health & hygiene training and occasional purchasing pots & pans and other requisites. Clearly as we have been unable to sustain a loss we have had to make a small surplus, which we have used to provide a more extravagant meal at Christmas. We have varied the cost of the meal from time to time according to costs always trying to ensure it was affordable.

This has been a venture close to our hearts and we would be very sad to see the Luncheon Club end. We are hopeful that an organisation or group of individuals may be moved to continue it or some similar community venture. We propose to hold lunches in April and May, (the May luncheon will be exactly 12 years since our first experimental effort to see if the venture would work) to give people a chance to contemplate whether this is an opportunity they wish to consider.

After the last lunch on May 8th there will be sufficient funds to provide another meal. If any individuals or organisation were able to continue the Luncheon Club, this money, together with equipment would be donated to the new group. There is also public liability insurance in place until the end of the year. If there is no current proposal to continue to Luncheon Club or anything similar we propose to give these funds to the VH Committee (subject to their agreement) to be held in a restricted fund as potential start up funds for a community venture. Large pots & pans we will keep and they can be borrowed for community or personal use (unless the Luncheon Club is continued in any form when we will give them to the new venture).

Finally a very big thank-you to the Village Hall Committee for their support and patience and everyone who has supported the luncheon club over the years. There have been well over 30 people who have been involved in helping with food preparation, cooking, serving, washing up giving lifts, preparing the hall, putting up and clearing tables. We could not have managed anything without these capable and loving people. You know who you are; we are reluctant to name you for fear of missing anyone out. It has been a privilege to meet and cook for so many people, if everyone who had ever been to the Lunch Club all turned up together we would definitely have to have more than one sitting. The club would have been nothing without the people who have come along to enjoy a meal whilst enjoying the company of their neighbours and (we hope) strengthening community support for each other.

In a way we hoped never to see this day, but it is of course inevitable – our dearest wish is that something new comes out of this thriving venture.



...TO ALL THOSE INVOLVED IN COMMON CONSERVATION WORK, WINTER 2014/15

Paul Denny – Operations Manager and the Volunteers have completed the work, agreed with Emily Deacon from Natural England.

Bracken sprayed, expect to see results this year. Silver birch felled in several places and wood has been cut and stored and eventually distributed to those who can benefit from it most. Sycamores removed and a fire-break created around Gorse View. Fire-breaks have been cut in some places. Large areas of scrub and grass removed, so that heather can eventually grow.

FEN'S MARGIN Well-over half the Fen has now been cleared as part of the ESA. Natural England Volunteers spent a day clearing the fen this year and achieved a huge amount in a short time.

RAILWAY CUTTING. Work was begun again on foot and bridle paths.

SHEEP PLANNED. Natural England want to introduce a small flock of sheep to help manage the Common along traditional lines. They will take out the young shoots of birch and gorse. WCLC, some time ago, agreed to a limited trial of grazing. The Charity's Scheme allows temporary fencing to help in land management. Flock will be protected by electrified sheep netting, so dog owners and sheep will be safely separate.



WILLIAM BOWYER RA (1926-2015)

One of Walberswick's most distinguished painters of recent decades, William Bowyer, has died, aged 88. Visits began in 1959, camping in a bivouac tent on what later became the camp-site. With his family he graduated to a caravan, and in 1993 bought The Knapp in Lodge Road and added a large garden studio.

Born in Leek, Staffs., he attended classes at Burslem School of Art. When called up for military service he became a 'Bevin Boy' (by 1944 many recruits were drafted into coal-mining) working at a nearby colliery. When peace returned he studied at the Royal College of Art before teaching in art schools for some thirty years, latterly as head of fine art at Maidstone College.

Elected RA in 1981, he retired from teaching to paint full-time. Known for his painterly studies of the Thames near Chiswick and the Blyth at Walberswick, he is represented in several public collections including the RA, Tate Britain and the Arts Council, while the National Portrait Gallery holds his studies of Arthur Scargill and Viv Richards. William brought his passion for cricket to Walberswick, and organised many summer matches. He is survived by his wife Vera, daughter Emma and his artist sons Francis and Jason.

We remain in dire need of a couple to supervise 'Bowling for the Ham', and volunteers of any age to run some simple, new party games.



We remain in dire need of a couple to supervise 'Bowling for the Ham', and volunteers of any age to run some simple, new party games.



EXCITING TREE - PLANTING PROJECT.

SUFFOLK COAST & HEATHS Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) has received funding to set up a 'Scattered Orchard' Project, to plant 5 local varieties of fruit or nut tree in our area. Suffolk and Essex once had many traditional orchards but these are now disappearing. Planting small clumps of traditional fruit or nut trees on publicly accessible land means local people can benefit from the trees, enjoy the blossom on the trees in the spring and eat the fruit/nuts in the autumn. These trees will not only provide habitats for a wide variety of wildlife but will be a community project on their doorstep, for future generations to enjoy.

All you need to be involved is a suitable piece of land on which to plant 5 fruit or nut trees, such as a recreational or community wildspace, village hall/school grounds, allotment, cemetery or village green. We will consult with the Suffolk Traditional Orchard Group regarding suitable local tree varieties for your location. If needed, we will undertake site visits with you to assess the suitability of your site and work with you to plant the trees in late autumn/winter. LETTER FROM THE OLM (Retired!)

As we come towards the close of the summer season, those on holiday as well as those who have homes in Walberswick will, hopefully, have been able to relax, enjoy & be refreshed by the beauty of God's creation that is all around us. Perhaps as you have stood on the beach & looked out on the unbounded mass of water that draws the eve, you will have gained a sense of the relentless motion of the water, the ebb & flow, which means that there is always something different to see, not least when the wind blows up & the waves get stronger. The power that we are aware of, as we look at the sea, may well help us to put into perspective our lives & the way that we live them. For the men & women of the Bible, the sea was often seen as a place of danger. 

BLYTH ESTUARY GROUP:

Public Meeting with the Environment Agency

More than a dozen Walberswick residents attended the Environment Agency's drop in session at the Southwold Sailing Club to hear about the revised scheme for the reinstatement of Robinson's Marsh wall.

EA had originally intended raising the wall from its present uneven height of 2.2m to 2.7m, to a constant level of 2.8m, the height of the 2013 surge at the Boat House. However, this was opposed by Blackshore residents and businesses who feared that raising the bank would increase their flood risk. To meet these concerns, EA now proposes incorporating into the bank opposite the Harbour Inn a 100m long spillway with a reduced height of 2.5m, to allow the controlled flooding of Robinson's Marsh under surge conditions to a depth of about 1m. After discussion, the meeting agreed that EA will proceed with the spillway proposal, subject to computer modelling of the revised scheme to determine anticipated flood levels.

The wall from the ferry crossing to Old Vicarage Cottage will be raised this October. Construction of the new wall and flood gate across Ferry Road and reinstating the river wall from the ferry crossing to the Bailey Bridge, will commence next May. During the works the riverside footpath will be diverted across the Marsh.

When completed, the works will protect Robinson's Marsh and property at risk in The Lea and Ferry Road from a 1 in 20 year storm surge. To maintain this level of protection against future sea level rise, it will be necessary to raise the banks again within the next half century.

PLANNING ADVISORY GROUP

The Planning Advisory Group was established in 2014 at the request of the Parish Council, following a recommendation of the Parish Plan aimed at strengthening the Council's response to planning applications referred for consultation by Suffolk Coastal District Council. The group comprises members of the Planning Working Party with professional knowledge and experience of planning and architecture.

The group's brief has been to assess planning applications against national and local planning policy and to report to the Parish Council. The reports are published as appendices to the Council minutes.

In the period from September 2014 to the suspension of the Parish Council in June 2015, PAG examined eleven applications. In every case the group's comments were incorporated into the Council's response to SCDC.

In addition, at the request of the Parish Council, PAG also participated in SCDC's Local Plan Review. Its reports can be found on the Council's website.

The work of PAG ceased in June when the Council became inquorate. To date, 17 planning applications have been referred, including eight relating to buildings, which have been or will be determined without comment from the Parish Council. Nor, until the position is reversed, can the Council participate further in the Local Plan review or the intended review of the Conservation Area boundary in 2016.

We will not be ruinous!

Restoration of the Ruins, St Andrew's Church, Walberswick

Your parish church PCC is delighted to announce that it has been awarded grants totalling £175,000 to enable much needed restoration and preservation work of our stunning, but crumbling church ruins. *The story broke in the EADT, October 3, 2015.*

Once the urgent repairs are completed these important, mainly coursed cobble flint, ruins will be rid of ivy, security wires and signage and be restored to the greatness their size and scale indicates, revealing the story of the history of the village dating back beyond the 15th century.

The work will preserve this part of our heritage for the future, enable greater access around the site, enhance the visitor experience and open up the area for community activities, even outdoor weddings!

How it came about

Earlier this year, Historic England, by invitation to visit the site, placed the ruins on its Heritage At Risk (HAR) register. Fortunately it was one of the bodies that made a significant grant to undertake the extensive repair and conservation work to the tune of £100,000 for which we are enormously grateful, in particular to its HAR Principal John Ette.

A successful application to WREN's FCC Heritage Fund brought in a further £75,000, and our appreciation goes to this not-for-profit business that awards grants for community, biodiversity and heritage projects from funds donated by FCC Environment through the Landfill Communities Fund.

A condition of the funding is that the work is completed by the end of the financial year March 2016. So we needed to act fast to make it happen.

Who is doing the work?

During the summer Nick Jacob Architects of Ipswich, who has been working with the PCC, and on the re-ordering at St Edmunds, Southwold, drew up the tender documents and he will oversee the project.

Following a three way tender R&J Hogg Ltd were awarded the contract, chiefly due to the amount of specialist knowledge they would bring to the project.

What happens next?

During the next few weeks contractors will start preparing the site ready for work to commence later in the month. Equipment will arrive and there will be more vehicle activity in the area along The Street and the side entrance to the church yard accessed via Church Lane.

Please could we ask for your patience and help while the work proceeds.

Autumn, winter and early Spring are not the most ideal weather-wise for this kind of specialised mortar work, so the scaffolding, erected to allow access to the ruins only, will have a canopy so work is not held up by inclement weather.

Please respect that the churchyard will become a building site. Multi-level work, some at a great height, other nearer ground level will be continuous, so there are health and safety risks if people stray into marked- off areas.

Please also be vigilant and do let Rev Simon Pitcher or any of the church wardens know if you feel suspicious about any activity on site.

John Hogg has very kindly agreed to host a couple of tour parties around the site to tell us about the detailed nature of the work and how they approach it.
