PEDESTRIAN ACCESS TO SOUTHWOLD

The environment agency aims to have repaired the river flood bank to enable the footpath between the ferry and the Bailey bridge to re-open by Christmas. Do not expect the Palmers Lane/Bailey Bridge track to re-open before Easter. The current plan is to raise the height of the track and strengthen it. This will take a further 2 to 3 months and involve over 600 lorry loads of material being delivered to site. Progress updates will be posted on the Parish notice boards.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT - 3RD DECEMBER, 2007

<u>Planning Applications</u> – The Parish Council had no objections to the erection of a single side extension to MILLSTONES, Millfield Road or to the erection of annexe holiday accommodation to LORNE COTTAGE, The Green (existing workshop to be demolished). The Council also had no objections to the variation of Condition 3 of planning permission C00/0582 to allow the use of the residential annexe as tourist accommodation at HARBOUR VIEW, The Green.

<u>Planning Decisions</u> – Planning permission had been granted by Suffolk Coastal for extensions to WINTON, The Street; STOCKS HOUSE, Stocks Lane and THE OLD VICARAGE COTTAGE. Planning permission had also been granted for the erection of two replacement dwellings at WAVENEY LODGE, The Street.

<u>Precept</u> – It was agreed to increase the precept by 5% to £7,292.00. This was the first increase in the precept since 2002.

<u>Post Office – A</u> robust response had been sent by the Parish Council to Post Office Ltd. in favour of keeping the Post Office open (copies can be seen on notice boards) in its present form or at least on a part time basis. The final decision of Post Office closures was due to be announced on 12th December. If necessary the Parish Council will call a public meeting to discuss the outcome with residents.

Sea Defences and Blyth Estuary - As a result of the recent flooding, the road to Southwold via the Bailey Bridge was impassable. Several breaches and overtopping of the banks had occurred to Tinkers and Robinsons Marshes. The Environment Agency was in the process of repairing the access road to Bailey Bridge with one tonne bags of clay. Once this was complete and Robinson Marsh drained, repairs would be carried out to Robinson Marsh footpath. If the Environment Agency decided against maintenance of Tinkers Marsh, they had stated that they would raise the height of the Bailey Bridge road by 1.4 metres and this would form the western defence of Robinson's Marsh. However, the fight would continue for the retention and maintenance of Tinkers Marsh.

The breaches from the flooding of 10/11th November had extended approximately a further 400 metres along the beach from Walberswick to Dunwich. A free flowing channel remained allowing water onto the marshes with every tide. Other channels had self healed. It was agreed to write to EA asking them to repair this breach. Councillor D Webb also reported that the Sea Defence Group had obtained an ordinance survey map of the coastline and he had prepared overlays showing three proposed lines for building sea defences, these ranged from saving all the shingle bank down to a smaller area finishing at the end of Stocks Lane. These would be forwarded to Dr Brampton. The Sea Defence Group had not, as yet, received a response from Dr Brampton.

<u>Emergency Plan</u> – The Chairman reported that an emergency plan leaflet would be delivered to every household in the village.

<u>Naming of new development in Adams Lane</u> – The Parish Council has been asked to come up with a name for the new development in Adams Lane. It should not be similar to existing road names in the vicinity. If anybody has any suggestions, please contact the Clerk at St Francis or by phone (723142) **Vivien Hunt (Clerk to Council)**

FLOOD DAMAGE REPAIR UPDATE

Walberswick to Dunwich Shingle Ridge

The seawater channel that had been cut through the shingle ridge (due East of Great Dingle Hill) in last December's storm has been filled by natural processes. Nevertheless it remains a weak point, which could easily be breached again in future storms.

Blyth Estuary

The Environment Agency repaired the river wall between the ferry and Bailey bridge and reopened the footpath before Christmas. However the Palmers Lane to Bailey bridge track is not likely to reopen before next June. The Environment Agency has plugged the breaches in the track but have considerable more work to do. The plan is to raise the track by about 1.4 metres (up to the same height as the river walls) and then put a clay face on the western (Tinkers marsh) side. This will make the track into a new flood defence wall. Telephone cables and the main sewer from Walberswick to Southwold run under the track and it is therefore very important to make it as strong as possible to minimise the risk of further breaches in future.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT - 7TH JANUARY, 2008

<u>Planning Applications – The Parish Council had no objections to the replacement of the existing roof to a pitched roof on the long barn at THE STABLES, The Street or to the erection of a front and rear extension to THE BEECHES, Millfield Road (resubmission). However, the Council opposed the application for the erection of a rear extension to THORPEVIEW, The Street and to the erection of a two-storey rear extension at HEATHWARD, Leveretts Lane.</u>

<u>Planning Decisions</u> – Planning permission had been granted by Suffolk Coastal to allow the use of the residential annexe as tourist accommodation at HARBOUR VIEW HOUSE, The Green. Permission had also been granted for the conversion and extension of an outbuilding to become a live/work unit (revised scheme) at Manor House, The Street.

Post Office - There had been no update on the Post Office.

Sea Defences and Blyth Estuary - Suffolk County Council had written to inform the Council that they intended to close Bridleway 8 (footpath between the old railway line and the Bailey Bridge) until 18th June 2008 and that an order would be made in due course to cover this period. Councillor Webb stated that this closure was because the Environment Agency intended to increase the height of the road in order for it to become the western defence for Walberswick.

The Clerk stated that a letter had been sent to the Environment Agency from the Blyth Estuary Group requesting that they make immediate repairs to the major breach of the river wall at Tinkers Marsh and also reinstate other breaches at Tinkers Marsh in order to comply with existing EA policies.

<u>Church Lane: Potholes</u> – This would be reported to the appropriate agency.

You will no doubt have been aware from your 2008 calendars that, not only are we in a leap year, but also that Easter will be with us very early this time around. I hasten to add that there is no connection between these two occurrences!

Before we arrive at Easter we will be travelling through the forty weekdays days of Lent, lasting from Ash Wednesday (6th February) to Holy Saturday (22nd March). PARISH COUNCIL REPORT - 4TH FEBRUARY, 2008

<u>Planning Applications</u> – The Parish Council had no objections to the conversion of a fixed stage to a floating pontoon at the Landing Stage, No: W05, Southwold Harbour, Walberswick Side,.

<u>Planning Decisions</u> – Planning permission has been granted by Suffolk Coastal for the following applications: 3, Lorne Cottages, The Green – erection of annexe holiday accommodation ancillary to Lorne Cottage; Thorpe View, The Street – erection of two-storey rear extension; The Beeches, Millfield Road – erection of front and rear extensions and new windows; and The Stables, The Street – replacement of mono-pitched roof with dual-pitched roof on the long barn.

<u>Church Lane</u> - Suffolk Heritage Housing have accepted responsibility for repairing the lane and works will be carried out in late March or early April.

Marram grass – An application has been submitted to Suffolk Coasts and Heaths for a grant from Connect (a locally funded scheme that supports conservation, access and awareness projects) to plant 1,000 marram grass plants to help preserve the sand banks. If the application is successful volunteers would be required to help plant the grass!

<u>Post Office</u> – Post Office Ltd. had still not made its final decision on the future level and type of service within the village.

<u>Village Green</u> – Major works will be commencing on repairing the track and other areas of the Village Green towards the end of February.

<u>Play equipment for the sportsfield</u> – Requests have been received for play equipment to be erected on the sportsfield. A study is being carried out and will be discussed at the Parish Council meeting in March.

<u>Goal posts for sportsfield</u> – Requests for goalposts have also been received. This will also be on the agenda for next month's meeting.



PUBLIC MEETING RE POST OFFICE UPDATE – 15TH MARCH. 2008

At the Parish Council meeting on 7th March the Parish Council decided to call a public meeting so that Nick and Gill Jones could introduce the new Core Postmaster to the residents of Walberswick and explain all aspects of their system, how it would work and what services it would provide. The meeting was duly held on 15th March with 72 residents attending. The Chairman of the Parish Council, Mrs Madeleine Dabbs, invited Gill and Nick Jones and David Turley, the new Core Postmaster, to speak. David Turley explained that the proposed outreach service for Walberswick will run three mornings a week:

Monday, Tuesday and Thursday between the hours of 9.30am and 12.30pm.

It will offer a full range of the services including: * Very competitive Travel Insurance * Post Office Savings Accounts * Post Office Credit Card (which attracts no interest if used abroad) * Renewal of car tax * Purchase of foreign currency.

He explained that the outreach service will be open for a **minimum of one year**. He will be responsible for all costs which includes rent of space in the Tuck Shop, and will be remunerated with a modest salary and a fee for **each transaction**. The business has to be profitable to continue and will be assessed after one year; so it is up to the people of Walberswick to use it or lose it.

Nick and Gill Jones stated that it was also necessary for residents to use the shop as it is predicted that 4 out of 5 village shops will fail once the post office service has been withdrawn. They stated that they were unable to compete with supermarkets but often had special offiers available and were disappointed when these were not always taken up. It is difficult to get a good deal with suppliers as their turnover is relatively small.

The Chairman thanked Nick and Gill Jones and David Turley for their presentation and reiterated the importance of using the services provided by both post office and village shop.

FRANK JENNINGS - ARCHITECT

A special feature of Walberswick is the group of Arts and Crafts homes clustered around Millfield Road and Leveretts Lane. What many people don't appreciate is the influence on this group of one man: Frank Jennings, a self-taught architect and developer who lived and practiced in Walberswick in the first part of the 20th century.

At last his life and work has now been told through a documentary presented by architect Bill Ungless and produced by Piers Ford-Crush. Bill tells a fascinating tale of an unconventional architect who incorporated into his designs often discarded elements of Tudor and Jacobean houses to create masterpieces such as Marshway and Mercers Hall. PARISH COUNCIL REPORT - 7TH APRIL 2008

<u>Planning Decisions</u> – Planning permission has been refused by Suffolk Coastal for the alterations, repairs and improvements, including erection of external staircase, at 2 Valley Farm.

<u>Keysafe Fitting Service</u> – Suffolk Acre provides this service which could benefit residents living on their own who have difficulty getting to the door. A Keysafe enables a relative, carer or other approved visitor to open the Keysafe by using a code to obtain the door key. They can let themselves in for the purpose of the visit without disturbing the resident. If anyone is interested in having a Keysafe fitted to their property, or the property of a relative, please contact **Matthew Morling** (from Suffolk Acre) on **01473 242521**. Information is also available on their website at www.suffolkacre.org.uk

<u>Marram grass</u> – A grant from the CONNECT Conservation Fund, for the purchase of marram grass, had been approved by Suffolk Coasts and Heaths. On Sunday, 30th March approximately sixty residents turned up to help with the planting of the 3000 seedlings. Many hands made light work: it was completed within 45 minutes! Thanks to all those who helped.

<u>Turf and posts on Village Green</u> – The turf had been watered on a daily basis until the rain came. It was agreed to monitor the turf and, if necessary, carry out further watering should the need arise. It was also agreed to send copies of the bye-laws, which state that there should be no parking on the Village Green, to all residents living in this vicinity.

<u>Play Equipment</u> – The Clerk stated that she had filled in grant forms from SCDC to enable the project for new swings and two spring mobiles to be erected. Permission had been requested and received from Walberswick Common Lands Charity Trust for the equipment to be erected on the sports field. They had also agreed to donate any shortfall in the funds.

<u>Other Issues</u> – Problems with the Sluice Bridge, Kissing Bridge and Road Bridge will all be reported to the appropriate authorities as well as the deterioration of Short Lane. **Vivien Hunt (Clerk to Council)**

SEA DEFENCE UPDATE

Public pressure is beginning to mount for a re-think of the government plans to abandon sea defences. To this end Walberswick Sea Defence Group is working with the Blyth Estuary Group and with engineering experts to identify sustainable solutions for this part of the coast. Brian Morton, who so successfully lead the SHARP (Southwold Harbour And River Protection) campaign, has joined the group as an advisor. As well as his professional expertise as an Engineer, he has experience, which could be very useful to us, of campaigning to save important parts of our history and heritage which others have written off as being too expensive to fix.

We have received the report that we commissioned from Dr Brampton of HR Wallingford. His conclusions are critical of the shallowness and short-sightedness of the EA plans for our part of the coastline although the work on the Blyth embankments is helpful in the short-term. He acknowledges that it would be uneconomical to keep bulldozing up the shingle ridge and argues for a more constructive approach to the long term protection of the village and its surroundings and for the participation of all stakeholders – landowners, representatives from the community, the EA and NE.

We will continue to keep you informed as our strategy develops.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - 7TH JULY, 2008

<u>Planning</u> – The Parish Council opposed the revised planning applications to Plot 1 and 2 at Waveney Lodge, The Street. They also opposed the size of the proposed erection of a cart lodge style garage and garden store at Fern Cottage, The Street.

<u>Planning decisions</u> – Suffolk Coastal had granted planning permission for the erection of a summer house at 2 Anchor Cottages; the erection of a rear extension at Mazoe; the erection of a single-storey garden room extension at Long Roof, Leveretts Lane; and the erection of a single storey extension and alterations to existing garage at Heathwold, Palmers Lane.

<u>Footpaths</u> – It was agreed to write to the Rights of Way Department of Suffolk County Council expressing the Council's frustration that new footpath signs had been erected when the footpaths remained uncut. They had now become virtually impassable for some people, with nettles up to six foot high and the grass and reeds falling onto the paths.

<u>Beach Parties</u> – The Councillors were also disappointed that yet another beach party had resulted in litter and broken bottles being strewn on the beach. Thanks were extended to Councillors K Webb and M Aldridge who had picked up six sacks of rubbish from the beach on Sunday 6th July. Discussions would continue with the Visitor Management team, Walberswick Car Parks Ltd. and the Trust on the way forward to resolve these issues.

Joint funded PCSO project – Councillor D Webb would be attending a presentation at Police HQ to hear details of the matched funding scheme. Additional PCSO's can be provided by means of a 'matched funding' scheme in which Suffolk Constabulary and a 'sponsor' (which could be a local community) jointly fund on a 50/50 basis. However with the cost predicted to be in the region of £14,000 to sponsor a PCSO for the village, the outcome is unlikely to be viable for Walberswick.

<u>Date of next meeting</u> – Please note the date of the next meeting is on **Monday 11th August**, one week later than usual.

LETTER FROM THE OLM

I am writing this letter on 15th July, and it has not rained yet! Why has the legend arisen that, if it rains on St Swithun's day it will then rain for forty days? Swithun was Bishop of Winchester in the ninth century; before he died he indicated that he wished to be buried 'humbly' and not in a shrine. When he died in 862 his wishes were followed. However, when a new cathedral was built Swithun's successor, Ethelwold, decided to move Swithun's remains into a shrine in the cathedral despite dire warnings that to move the bones would bring terrible storms. Swithun's remains were moved on 15th July 971 and, apparently, it rained for the next forty days (we have no meteorological records to confirm that!!).

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING – 11TH AUGUST, 2008

<u>Planning</u> – The Parish Council had no objections to the erection of a conservatory at SPRING-FIELD, The Lea or to the replacement of a timber landing stage with a floating pontoon at LAND-ING STAGE 4, Southwold Harbour, Walberswick side.

<u>Footpaths</u> – A letter had been received from Annette Robinson, East Area Rights of Way Manager, apologising for the lateness of cutting the paths in Walberswick. The Contractor had been instructed to attend to the paths in mid May and despite many assurances this was not carried out. She would be reviewing his contract at the end of the season.

<u>Proposed Boundary Changes</u> – The Parish Council was unhappy about the Boundary Committee for England's (BCE) proposals for changes in Suffolk. The BCE preferred options were:

- (1) A unitary council covering Ipswich, Felixstowe, Kesgrave and 17 other parishes currently in Suffolk Coastal as well as 19 in Babergh and 7 in Mid-Suffolk combined with a unitary council covering the rest of Suffolk but excluding Lowestoft or
- (2) One council covering all of Suffolk but excluding Lowestoft. It was felt that both proposals were ill-thought-out and would be a waste of taxpayer's money. If changes **had** to be made, it was felt that splitting Suffolk into East and West was a preferable option, leading to better local accountability. Councillors Robin Buncombe and Alvin Hunt are to prepare a written response.

<u>Parish Plan</u> – The Parish Council plans to hold a public meeting on Monday 13th October at 7pm in the Village Hall so that the community can decide whether they wish to produce a Parish Plan for the village. Further details will be posted on the Parish Council notice boards and in the September Village News.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING – 6TH OCTOBER, 2008

<u>Planning</u> – The Parish Council had no objections to the erection of a timber storage shed at The <u>Drift</u>, <u>Leveretts Lane</u> or to a replacement pontoon at <u>Landing Stage W24A</u>, the Harbour. Suffolk Coastal had granted planning permission for development at <u>Manor House</u>, TheStreet; <u>The Net Shed</u>, Ferry Road and <u>Springfield</u>, The Lea - subject to the alterations/building being carried out in accordance with the submitted plans and conditions set by the Authority.

<u>Post Office</u> – In response to concerns expressed about operational difficulties being experienced at the new outreach service, the Parish Council agreed to write to Post Office Ltd. asking them to resolve the problems.

Adams Lane/Nightingale Close sign – The new sign was now in place.

<u>Sheltered Housing proposal</u> – The Council had been asked for their opinion on a new venture to build sheltered housing in the village. The proposal would be to build four leasehold, detached bungalows which included conditions that would ensure they were purchased by over 55's and not allowed to be sold on for holiday lets. The Parish Council considered that this was a very welcome proposal and supported it in its initial stage.

<u>Swimming Pools</u> – The Parish Council had put forward a motion to the SALC (Suffolk Association of Local Councils) Conference that 'SALC urges NALC (National Association of Local Councils) to lobby government to bring in a requirement that all domestic swimming pools should be the subject of planning permission by the Local Authority'.

PARISH COUNCIL INFORMATION

DAMAGE TO SEA DEFENCES

The influx of summer visitors inflicts a lot of wear and tear on the dunes and shingle ridge (our sea defence line). Bonfires, camping and digging cause most of the damage and the Parish Council is also concerned at the litter, cans and broken bottles left by irresponsible late night revellers.

It is unfortunate that the Environment Agency does nothing to enforce Land Drainage and Sea Defence Byelaws under which it is an offence to damage the sea defences or vegetation growing on them. However we can all do our bit by asking visitors to treat our environment with care and respect.

Bonfires are permitted on the beach (but NOT the dunes or shingle ridge) with the prior permission of the appropriate District Council (WDC for harbour to beach huts and SCDC from beach huts to Dunwich). The HM Coastguard also has to be informed.

The Parish Council has requested that Cliff Field car park be closed overnight at weekends, and other times as necessary, to try and reduce incidents of late night vandalism. Any inconvenience this may cause to those who like a late evening or early morning walk on the beach, is much regretted.

HEDGES AND HIGHWAYS

Please make sure your hedges are not hanging out over the roadways, effectively making the road even narrower. With a lot of visitors and traffic in the village it is important to keep hedges trimmed back.

TREES IN A CONSERVATION AREA

There have been reports of trees being removed or pruned in the village Conservation Area possibly without planning permission. The Parish Council has obtained the following regulations imposed by Suffolk Council to which all residents should adhere. Failure to do so could lead to prosecution.

- 1. Any tree with a girth of more than 75mm (about the size of a baked bean tin) at breast height should have permission before being felled or pruned.
- 2. Permission should be requested at least six weeks before the planned felling or pruning.
- 3. Permission will normally be granted by letter.
- 4. Permission may be given by e-mail or telephone, but this <u>will be recorded</u> by the Tree Preservation Officer at Suffolk Coastal.

PALMERS LANE/BAILEY BRIDGE TRACK

The Environment Agency should now be back on site to complete their work on Palmers Lane/Bailey Bridge track. This will include re-profiling the bank, facing with clay, seeding with grass, repairs to the road and resurfacing with "tarmac". Use of the track will be restricted during the works, which should be completed by mid July.



Post Office Update

Due to concerns many are expressing we have been asked to give you all an update on the changes to the Post Office services within the village

After a furthe review the service within the village is to be changed to an out-reach service for 10 hours a week. Post Office Ltd has agreed to relax some of their original stipulations particularly regarding the Disability compliance. With this new flexibility we have requested that they work with us and consider operating these services within the shop. This will require a re-gig of the shop as one aspect that is not acceptable to PO Ltd is for the service to remain behind the screens in its present position. We will also have to form a working relationship with the new core Postmaster, as ultimately it is his decision.

There have been a lot of requests for more details of the services to be provided within the out reach facility. Whilst these are restricted, there may be a degree of flexibility dependent upon the core Postmaster.

PO Ltd is at present working on the outright closures taking place in February (i.e. those where no out-reach is to be provided). They will then start to implement the out-reach changes for Wangford and Wrentham. At present no core Postmaster has agreed to accept Walberswick for out-reach facilities, but two will have been interviewed by the time you read this.

We strongly urge you to continue using your Post Office, as we are concerned that if PO Ltd can show people are making alterative arrangements the service may be reduced or lost altogether.

We had planned to give you a more detailed report at the Parish Council's proposed Parish meeting on the 23rd January. Sadly it did not take place, but we will give more details at the at the Parish Council meeting on Monday the 4th February 7.30pm as the situation is to be discussed.
