WINTER ROADS TREATMENT

The County Council's policy for treating roads in this area during the winter is as follows:

Priority 1 network is all principal and primary routes, plus selected other roads including all B roads.

Priority 2 network is a wider network which includes at least 1 route to all main villages, regular bus routes and for access to most LEA schools.

If *ice only* is expected then Priority 1 network roads are gritted - 1095 miles of road, using approx 140 tonnes of salt. If snow and ice are expected to persist then we grit Priority 1 and Priority 2 network roads - 1660 miles out of 3900 miles of road in the county, using 330 tonnes of salt. We start the season with 15,500 metric tonnes of salt in 10 'strategic' locations across the county. 39 vehicles run from 10 locations across the county. We treat 1095 miles (1760kms), which is 28% of the network. It's all A and B roads, and other roads where there is a presumption of more than 4000 movements a day. This includes access to main hospitals and 24/7 fire stations. We have a modern fleet of gritters which use wetted salt, and special additives to help the salt stick better to the road. There are arrangements in place to bring over 300 local farmers and contractors out on to the roads to assist with snow clearing if necessary. Each treatment costs approximately £10,000 in direct costs.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING – 1ST DECEMBER, 2008

<u>Planning</u> – The Parish Council had no objections to the erection of an external staircase and dormer window, replacement of existing windows and insertion of new windows to 2, VALLEY FARM, Ferry Road (Application No: C08/1947/1948) or to the extension of existing store to provide two lockable stores at THE STABLES, The Street (Application No: C08/2019/2020). The Parish Council also had no objections to the removal of an internal wall to create a larger opening between the kitchen and breakfast room at MERCERS HALL, The Street (Application No: C08/1860 – Listed building consent).

<u>Post Office</u> – The Chairman reported that there were still problems with failures to the online system at the post office which was extremely frustrating for the Subpostmaster and customers alike. The Council had written twice to Post Office Ltd who had informed them that the problems were being rectified. The Chairman stated that it was vitally important for residents to continue to use the post office despite the problems being experienced at present. The Council would continue to press for an acceptable service for the village.

<u>Housing</u> – Mrs Janet McNeill, Area Manager of Suffolk Heritage Housing, had informed the council that their new scheme 'Choice Based Lettings' would become operational in SCDC in February 2009. She stated that it is important that any resident in the village with a housing need (now or in the future) should apply immediately. Revised scheme of Walberswick Common Lands Charity Trust - Presentation by Miss Barbara Priestman and Mr James Darkins - Miss Priestman, Chairman, explained that the Charity Trust constitution needed updating to reflect current best practice in the terms of the administration and operation of the charity and in part to reflect the requirements of the new Charities Act 2006 which became fully effective in 2008. Mr Darkins explained all the changes that had been proposed. The Chairman, Mrs Madeline Dabbs, considered that these changes should now be discussed by the Parish Councillors before replying to the Common Lands Charity Trust. This would be placed on the agenda in January.

LETTER FROM THE OLM

BEN SUTTON

Ben was one year older than me, so we grew up together in Walberswick. We both attended the village school, taught by Mrs. Hargreaves. As teenagers, we chased girls together, and Ben used to attract a lot of posh girls from London: with his long hair, fur waistcoat and fur boots, he looked like a rock star in the 60s.

His first job was as an apprentice with Baggotts the butcher in Southwold: later he worked for two years in London for the Gas Board. He worked as a driver for Blyth Hazell Removals, and for many years until his death worked for Duncan & Sons as a lorry driver. At one time he and two friends owned identical cars, borrowing parts from each other in order to scrape past the MOT. He acted as father and mother to his two boys, Adam and Lee, and when anybody complained about them he refused to believe it: he thought sunshine came out of their backsides. Unlike the rest of us, he didn't own a gun: fishing was what he loved, and he had worked on a fishing boat as a teenager. I took him fishing for years and, no matter who was on the boat, he would never let anyone interfere. He went fishing with me a month before he died.

Though each year he said he wouldn't help with the crabbing contest, on the day he would turn up with the lines and weights which he had spent hours making at home; on November 5th he was always there to light the fire and let off fireworks. He was a regular sight in the Anchor, where he objected to children coming into the bar; and he often sat with his back to the company in his typically grumpy way. He was a real Walberswick character, and we will miss him. **Wally Webb**

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING – 1ST DECEMBER, 2008

<u>**Planning**</u> – The Parish Council had no objections to the erection of a replacement dwelling at INNISFREE, Leveretts Lane (revised scheme). Councillor K Webb declared an interest and took no part in the discussions. The Councillors also had no objections to the erection of a single storey extension and demolition of existing outbuilding at MAFEKING, The Green. However, they were concerned about access for builders' vehicles as they did not want the recent work on the green to be spoiled.

<u>Revised scheme of Walberswick Common Lands Charity Trust</u> – The majority of Parish Councillors opposed clause 4 of the proposed revised scheme, which changed the composition of the Trustees from four Nominative Trustees from the Parish Council to three. The Council's concerns were that the perception of the Trust should be one of public trust, transparency and confidence in the parish. This change could have an adverse effect. It was agreed that the Parish Council would write to the Trustees asking them to reconsider this change. It was also recommended that the parishioners should have the opportunity to discuss the proposed changes with the Trustees before the revised document was sent to the Charity Commissioners for acceptance.

<u>Parish Plan</u> – Four volunteer residents had carried out a survey on the viability of a Parish Plan for Walberswick by contacting other villages who had processed the plan. It was generally considered that a Parish Plan could be an asset to the village. Another public meeting may be called after discussions amongst the volunteers.

<u>**History Group**</u> – Permission was given by the Parish Council for the History Group to take photographs of the village scroll for use at an exhibition at the Southwold museum in March. <u>**Horse riding on the sand dunes**</u> – It was reported that there has been evidence of horse riding on the sand dunes. Riders are reminded that this is an offence under 'The Land Drainage and Sea Defence Byelaws'. More importantly, it is vital not to damage our vulnerable sea defences.



OUR COMMON

Walberswick Common is not registered as "Common Land" under the Parliamentary Act. Walberswick Common Lands Charity (WCLC) is the registered owner of the "Common" and other parcels of land within the parish, which the Charity holds on behalf of the parishioners of Walberswick.

The "Common" is included, with the Charity's other land, in a DEFRA "Environmental Stewardship Scheme", which provides grants for environmental works, and the "Common" is being managed by WCLC to a plan drawn up by Natural England. Work undertaken by the "*Winter Wednesday Volunteers*" follows this plan.

In my youth it was management by fire: around Easter each year a section of the common very mysteriously caught fire and large overgrown areas were cleared in a 12-hour blaze. These fires could be quite frightening and it is hoped to avoid such scares by using the current management plan, but it will still be necessary to dispose of some piles of cut material by burning. A progress report and information on the common will be included in the Village News from time to time. **David Webb**

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - 2ND FEBRUARY, 2009

<u>Planning</u> – Suffolk Coastal District Council had approved an extension to the existing store and a further extension to provide two lockable stores at <u>The Stables</u>, <u>The Street</u> – subject to the work being carried out in accordance to the submitted plans and conditions set out by the authority.

Allotments - All allotments were now taken. It was agreed that the rents should remain the same for the year 2009 -2010.

Fencing play area of sports field – The Clerk and Councillor Aldridge had staked out the area for the proposed fencing of the play area. Councillor K Webb agreed to obtain prices for the fencing.

<u>Climbing Frame</u> -- Councillor Aldridge asked if it was possible to raise enough money to purchase a climbing frame for the play area on the sports field. County Councillor Rae Leighton stated that it might be possible to obtain £500 from the Locality Grant. Councillor Buncombe thought the Crabbing Championship would be able to help. The Clerk agreed to obtain quotes and approach Suffolk coastal DC to see if there was any money available for Walberswick in their Play Scheme.

<u>Water on Robinson Marsh – Councillor</u> K Webb reported that there was much more water on Robinson Marshes than usual. It was agreed to write to the Eastern Area Manager of the Environment Agency to ask them to see if there was a fault on the Charity Sluice.

<u>Timber washed up on the beach</u> - Approximately 50 tons of timber had been washed up on Walberswick beach as a result of a recent shipwreck. Many people had been on the beach salvaging some of the timber. Councillor Buncombe stated that anybody collecting timber must report it to the Receiver of Wreck (under section 236 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1995).

NATURE NOTES ON THE COMMON

Reptiles on the common are the Common Lizard, Slow Worm (a legless lizard), Grass Snake and Adder. The Grass Snake is larger than the Adder; females can grow over 120 cm (4 ft) in length (males are shorter); it is non-venomous. Coloured grey/green, often with black spots and usually a yellowish collar, with golden eyes. If threatened, Grass Snakes will play dead. The Adder, Britain's only venomous reptile, grows up to 65cm (just over 2 ft) in length. The females are usually brown with dark marking; the males (smaller than the females) vary in colour from grey-buff to green. Both sexes have red-brown eyes and normally a zigzag pattern down the back - not always clear on dark coloured Adders. Adders are not aggressive, will try to get out of harm's way and only attack if threatened. Their venom poses little danger to a healthy adult but the bite is very painful and requires urgent medical attention. The smaller the victim's body, the more effect the venom will have.

At this time of year the Adders are coming out of hibernation. If you see one on a path – stamp your feet on the ground and it will move off.

Note: if a snake does not have a yellowish collar, play save and assume it is an Adder.

There are three varieties of Gorse on the Common. European Gorse, the tallest variety, grows to 2.5 metres (8 feet) and even higher in places. This gorse flowers in winter- spring. Western Gorse grows up to 2 metres in height and flowers summer – autumn. Finally there is Dwarf Gorse. This grows up to about 1.5 metres in height and flowers mainly in the summer. The smaller bushes provide better habitat for wildlife and the management plan is to encourage the lower growing varieties and restrict the larger ones. David Webb, Volunteer Joint Warden

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - 2ND MARCH, 2009

<u>Planning</u> – As most of their objections from the previous application had been addressed, the Parish Council had no objections to the erection of a two-storey dwelling at HIDDEN HUT, The Green. The Parish Council supported the application for the erection of a side extension, creation of a first floor verandah and other external alterations to SALTINGS, Seven Acres Lane. Councillor Hunt declared an interest in this application, left the room, and took no part in the discussions.

<u>Water on Robinson Marsh</u> - The Environment Agency had checked the Charity Sluice and reported that it was working normally. They considered the amount of water on the marsh was caused by the very wet and snowy winter.

<u>Post Office</u> – The Clerk produced a number of letters which had been sent (and received) by the Parish Council to Post Office Ltd. and John Gummer MP over the last few months. It was felt by Councillors that these letters had hopefully been of some help in procuring the proposed new system which is to be installed in the near future. This should ensure that Walberswick Post Office can offer a service to their customers without any further problems. The Clerk was thanked for all her work on this matter.

<u>Revised bus services operating in Walberswick</u> – Revised times of the bus service from Walberswick to Beccles had been received: The bus leaves Walberswick Harbour at 9.25am and arrives in Beccles at 10.25; leaves Beccles Old Market Bus Stand at 1.00pm and arrives back in Walberswick at 2.00pm. The bus runs on Tuesday and Friday. This allows people to have 2 ½ hours shopping time in Beccles. Full details can be seen on the Parish Council notice board at the Village Hall and on the Stocks Green notice board.

<u>Adoption of the New Model Publication Scheme (Freedom of Information Act 2009)</u> -It was proposed by Councillor Buncombe seconded by Councillor Hunt and unanimously supported that the new scheme be adopted by Walberswick Parish Council.

Parish Plan - The Chairman reported that fourteen volunteers had come forward to help produce the plan. The group had applied for grants and preparing the plan would not commence until these were in place. The Common Lands Charity Trust had also agreed to support this project.

NATURE NOTES FROM THE COMMON

There are lions and tigers on the common, but you will have to look very hard to find them.

Look closely in sunny sites that have little vegetation and areas of bare ground, and you may see a bright green beetle - the **Green Tiger Beetle**.

Also on the common we have <u>Antlions</u>. The adult Antlion resembles dragonflies or damselflies, and like the latter is a poor flyer. It is seldom seen because it is only active in the evening; during the day it rests motionless, well camouflaged by its dusk body and transparent wings.

The Antlion gets its name from the larval stage. The brown hairy larva preys mainly on ants and can be said to be a "lion" among ants. The larva digs a shallow cone-shaped pit (in sandy soil), then waits at the bottom of the pit. Eventually an ant, or other small insect, enters the cone and the loose sand slips (like a miniavalanche); the insect falls into the bottom of the pit where it becomes a tasty meal for the waiting larva. NATURE NOTES FROM THE COMMON You can find three different heathers on the common: <u>Bell Heather (*Erica cinerea*)</u> – This plant prefers drier heath land and has purple 'bell-like' flowers that bloom from May to September.

<u>Crossed-leaved Heath (Erica tetralix L.)</u> - Soft grey/ green foliage, with leaves set in whorls of four, at the top of which is a cluster of pinkish bell shaped flowers. It blooms from June to October, favours damp acid soil and can be found in the fen area (on the far side of the old railway track).

<u>Common Heather or Ling (Calluna vulgaris)</u> – Generally has mauve flowers (they may occasionally be white) that appear late summer. The name Calluna vulgaris comes from the Latin 'vulgaris' for common and the Greek 'Kallune' to clean or brush (the twigs were used for making brooms). The alternative name "Ling" is derived from the Old Norse 'Lyng' meaning fire, referring to the plant's use as a fuel. **David Webb (Joint Volunteer Warden)**



THE HERITAGE HUT

For many years a team of volunteers has run a visitor centre at the former chapel on the village green. They have done this on behalf of Suffolk Heritage Coast Project and, more recently, the Suffolk Coast & Heaths Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) Unit, who still manage the centre today.

It has been a long-held wish to see the centre refurbished, and last year this became possible. The old displays dated from the 1980s and needed to be replaced. As the main purpose of the Suffolk Coast & Heaths Unit is to care for and promote the AONB – a nationally-important, legally protected landscape – this was the main focus of the refurbishment.

This has attracted significant criticism, as many people in the village thought that the features that made the centre special and particular to Walberswick have been lost. There have been a number of valuable comments and suggestions, and it is clear from these that the visitor centre volunteers should have had more opportunity to influence changes at the centre.

As the new AONB Manager, I believe the changes to the centre have been positive, but I accept many of the criticisms and I am committed to working with the village. There is still plenty of opportunity to make changes that will promote the AONB, while also providing an interesting Walberswick-specific experience for visitors and volunteers alike. I shall be working with Maureen Thompson to ensure a mutually-acceptable outcome.



NATURE NOTES

Summer is here and so are Jelly Fish and Weaver Fish, both of which can give a nasty sting. Jellyfish have tentacles covered with sacs (nematocysts) that release toxins. If stung, gently scrape the area with something like a credit card; do **not rub** the area as this could cause yet more toxins to be released. Apply a tissue soaked in vinegar to the affected area for 20 to 30 minutes. Remember to take a small bottle of vinegar with you to the beach. Weaver Fish, which often lie partly buried in the sand, have venomous spines on their dorsal fin. If you stand on a Weaver the result will be extremely painful. The venom is deactivated by heat, so you should immerse the affected area in very hot water for about 15 minutes. Then check the area and remove any bits of the spine that remain in the wound. If in doubt seek medical advice. **David Webb**



MIKE JEANS 1922-2009

Mike came to live in Walberswick aged 10, when his father the playwright Ronald Jeans bought Valley Farm. His early years in the village were supported and enhanced by his partner in crime Lucian Freud, both at home and at boarding school.

During the war, Ronald and Mike ran the Barn Cinema at Valley Farm to entertain the troops and the village, until Mike enlisted in the Fleet Air Arm.

In 1950 Mike started the East Point Pottery, selling to outlets such as Heals in London, and also in Southwold Market Place.

With the start of Commercial Television in 1956, Mike joined ATV as a director/producer, making many diverse series. When Anglia TV began in Norwich Mike moved there, where he was responsible for amongst others starting About Anglia and also giving David Frost his first TV appearance. In 1964 he returned to ATV where, during the making of his series Rules Rules Rules, Mary Whitehouse called Mike "the chief corrupter of youth"! Retirement brought him back to Southwold, which he adored almost as much as Walberswick. I shall miss the sight of him, sailor's hat perched on his head, careering down the High Street on his electric cycle.

Residents will be glad to see that the Environment Agency are finally replacing the **Chestnut Fencing** around the **Dunes**. The Parish Council are doing their utmost to replace the **Emergency Phone** down on the river, and hopefully this will be done soon. A letter was received from John Gummer MP thanking the Parish Council for their support over **Ship to Ship Transfers**. Subsequent press reports suggest that the practice is going to be stopped.

Planning Matters: The Parish Council held an extra Planning meeting on the 21st September. At this notification had been received that the application at **Walber House** had been approved. The Council also considered the plans for the erection of a new dwelling at **Redmay.** Whilst the Council had no planning objections, a letter of concern was sent to the Planning Office regarding the continued practice of sub-dividing larger plots as it is felt that this will have a negative effect on the character of the village.

At the meeting of the 5th October the Council was notified that the application for the demolition of **Pleach Cottage** was approved; however the application for a replacement dwelling was refused in its current form. The Council also considered the application for the erection of a detached dwelling at **Troy, Churchfield.** Again, no planning objections were raised but as with Redmay above, concerns were expressed to the Planning Office at this continued practice.

<u>River Wall</u>: The Council was also informed that the Application for the river wall reinstatement on behalf of the Blyth Estuary Group had also been approved.

Cllr Buncombe made a report to the Council about the **proposed dredging off Southwold** and it was agreed to contact MP John Gummer expressing our concerns.

Finally there will be a **Beach Clean** on Sunday 15th November. Please look out for notices as to times and starting points. Your help is appreciated.



PARISH COUNCIL MEETING MONDAY 2ND NOVEMBER 2009

The **Emergency phone** by the Harbour Wall is now operational again: just lift the receiver and dial 999; there is no dial tone but you will be connected. The **lifebelts** have once more been vandalised but are being replaced. The **flag pole** was damaged last month when it appears a lorry hit it. It has been laid on its side for safety reasons and is being repaired.

Planning Matters:

Listed building consent was approved for 2 Valley Farm, Ferry Road; and the erection of extensions, a new garage and a new detached dwelling in the garden of Redmay, Lodge Road, was also approved.

<u>Planning Applications were received for the following</u>: A revised scheme for Land at Rear of Alexandra Cottage, The Street: the Council felt the new scheme was far more in keeping with the surrounding buildings and saw no planning reasons to object but were still extremely concerned about the access on to the street.

The following two <u>Applications</u> were received too late for the 2 November meeting but a second planning meeting was held on the 9 November when they were discussed:

Saltings, Seven Acres Lane: construction of a new dwelling to replace the current dwelling. The Council objected on the grounds that this development was not remotely in keeping with its surroundings, was overly large and box-like in design.

Westwood, the Street: the erection of a new sculpture studio and new boundary wall. The Council had no objections to the studio, but were concerned about the height of the new proposed boundary wall, which appears to be over 8ft!.

Formal application had been received from Long Roof, Leveretts Lane, for the removal of 20 trees from the rear of the property. Representations were made from residents and it was agreed to contact Suffolk Coastal and Natural England to obtain further information about nesting and the impact of removing these trees. It was also agreed to object in principle to the Tree Works Notice while further information was obtained.

As County Councils are now ordered to turn their **Planning Applications** round in 8 weeks, we are obliged to respond to applications within 21 days with little chance of an extension. If you are affected by a Planning matter, please do not hesitate to make contact with either the Clerk or any of the Councillors. If it does not appear on the Agenda for the regular Council meeting, another meeting will be arranged one or two weeks later, with the Agenda being posted in the normal manner.

As no one has objected to the proposed **Extension to Car Park Operations** the Council agreed to begin the formal process.

A Meeting took place at the end of October at the Sailing Club, hosted by the prospective Southwold Harbour Lands Trustees, to consider the updated H R Wallingford report which offered up the options for the **repair**/**replacement of the North Dock Wall**. It was a very constructive meeting and the Parish Council fully support the chosen option. This has gone back to WDC for their consideration and it is hoped that work will begin by October 2010.

WALBERSWICK PARISH COUNCIL

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FROM THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 16TH APRIL

The Chairman, Mrs. Madeline Dabbs, commenced her report by stating that it had been, surprisingly, a very busy year for the Council. The affordable housing project in Nightingale Close had been completed. The Parish Council had expressed concerns to The Housing Association that had not taken into account the cost of housing in Walberswick when dismissing applications from local people, claiming their salaries were too high for such housing. However, there had now been a change of policy but it was vitally important that all people ensured they were on the waiting list and not just apply when they found out that a house was going to become vacant.

The Parish Council had been very concerned when it realised that very little constraint was put on home owners who wanted to erect a swimming pool in their garden. This Council successfully took to the Suffolk Association of Local Councils and who unanimously supported, a motion to urge the National Association of Local Councils to push the Government for stricter controls on the proposed installation of a permanent pool at private properties.

The children's play area on the sports field had benefitted from more play equipment during the year but unfortunately the Council was being forced to fence off the area because of dog fouling. She stated that in future dogs could be banned from the playing field and the beach if owners did not become more responsible in clearing up after their animals.

The Chairman informed the meeting that all the Parish Councillors and the Clerk were members of the Sea Defence Group. This was not on the agenda as the village had recently been updated on this work.

The allotments, after some years of partial neglect, had now sprung back into life and all those on the waiting list had now been allocated allotments (or parts thereof).

As Chairman of the Parish Council, she had been invited to be part of a group which looked at where the new 'Healthy Living Centre' would be situated. She was pleased to report that this should be up and running within a couple of years on a much more accessible and suitable site.

The saga of the Post Office occupied a lot of the Council's time. Letters to Post Office Ltd. (frequently unanswered) and to our MP John Gummer, about the appalling level of service being received due to technical difficulties, were fast and furious. We now, at last, have got a permanent computer connection which had made the service much more reliable.

In October the Parish Council called a public meeting to hear about and discuss a Parish Plan. After consultation with other parishes by a small group of volunteers, it was agreed that the village would develop a plan, although a considerable amount of work would be necessary to achieve this.

The arrival of 50 - 100 tons of wood on our beach brought interest from afar. The arrival of many visitors, not to enjoy the sea and sand but to collect the wood, was a spectacle. It was soon cleared from the beach and hopefully those who took it reported their actions to the Recorder of Wreck!

The Council had recently taken the decision to apply to become a Quality Council. Much of the criteria had already been met but one change required that time was allotted for parishioners to discuss problems with the Council. Therefore, in future time would be set aside between 7.15pm until 7.30pm before a council meeting (normally first Monday of every month) specifically for this. A further requirement was that the Clerk should obtain a Certificate in Local Council Administration (CILCA). As the present Clerk, Mrs. Vivien Hunt, was retiring from the position it was essential that the new Clerk was prepared to work for this qualification. At this point the Chairman introduced the new Clerk, Miss Mischi Vernetti, who would be taking up the appointment on 1st June (Mischi had agreed to study for this qualification as part of her duties).

She stated that another requirement to becoming a Quality Council was to have a web-site and this was already up and running, thanks to the hard work of Mrs. Kay Ungless. The website can be found at <u>www.onesuffolk.co.uk/parish</u>. On this site dates and times of meetings, agendas and minutes of the Parish Council could be found along with many other interesting items.

The Walberswick Common Lands Charity Trust had consulted the Parish Council about the revision of their constitution. The proposal for the reduction of nominative trustees (from 4 to 3) was opposed by the majority of the Parish Council. The WCLCT have since withdrawn this change.

She stated that all the aforementioned had not covered the many hours of extra work undertaken by members of this Parish council. She explained that the work of the Parish Councillors was not just about meeting monthly to make decisions. Responding to what can only be described as a deluge of correspondence and e-mails, sifting out what was urgent and what was relevant to us and acting accordingly was another part of the duties. Dealing 'hands on' with day to day problems and queries raised by parishioners when out in the village was yet another. She thanked the Parish Councillors for their work and support throughout the year.

The Chairman thanked the Clerk, Mrs. Vivien Hunt, for all the work she had put in over the past twelve years as Clerk. Finally she presented her with a bouquet of flowers and wished her well in her retirement.

History of the Charity

In 1901, the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice approved and established a "Scheme for the regulation and administration of the Charity known as the Common Lands in the Parish of Walberswick in the County of Suffolk and for the application of income thereof".

Under the Scheme seven Trustees, including the Vicar and the Chairman of the Parish Meeting and the Board of Guardians, were to manage land comprising

84.5 acres of heath land34 acres of enclosed grazing marshes40 acres of salt marshes3.5 acres of marsh land.

The heath land is most of what we know as the Common, the "enclosed grazing marshes" lie between the Village and the River Blyth and the "salt marshes" are those behind the beach which are not owned by the Blois estate. The remaining land comprises what is now the Cliff Field and Ferry Road car parks, the latter including the land occupied by the houses and huts alongside the river. Since the original Scheme, two properties (The Potters Wheel and the building now known as the Lantern Gallery) plus some parcels of land have been kindly donated to the Charity including, most recently, Bennett's Copse and Bennett's Drift.

As well as providing for maintenance of the Charity's land and property, the 1901 Scheme empowered the Trustees to apply surplus income to helping individual Walberswick residents who were in need and to supporting initiatives that were of general benefit to the inhabitants of Walberswick. These charitable activities continue today in the form of individual grants such as home improvements to cope with disability or assistance with educational expenses, through to more general projects such as providing children's play equipment and supporting local schools and charities.

The current Trustees are; Ms Barbara Priestman (Chairman), Mr James Darkins, Rev Brian Fisher, Mrs Kate Goodchild, Mr Nigel Hunt, Mr David Webb and Mr Keith Webb.

The Scheme

The original 1901 Scheme was subsequently reviewed and amended in 1925, 1932, 1963 and, most recently, 1985. The Scheme is a requirement under the Charities Act and sets out the objectives of the Charity and the rules under which Trustees are required to operate. Unlike a Company where the Directors have wide discretion over both the strategy and day to day decisions of the Company, the Trustees must operate within the more limited scope of the Scheme and the Charities Act.

The Trustees wish to update the Scheme in part to reflect current best practice in terms of the administration and operation of charities and in part to reflect the requirements of the new Charities Act 2006 which became fully effective in 2008. The services of solicitors Bates Wells & Braithwaite of London (ranked 1st in an independent survey of UK charity specialists in 2007) were engaged to advise Trustees on the Scheme. The Trustees have reviewed the Scheme based upon the advice they have received. They now wish to have the Scheme formally approved by the Charities Commission and are required to observe the following procedure:

2.4

- 1. Adoption of a draft Scheme by the Trustees completed
- 2. Consultation with Walberswick Parish Council commenced
- 3. Submission of the Scheme to the Charities Commission in progress
- 4. Consultation with the inhabitants of Walberswick beginning
- 5. Finalisation of the Scheme by Trustees
- 6. Approval of the Scheme by the Charities Commission

Changes to the Scheme

Most importantly no changes are proposed to: (i) the requirement for the Trustees to act as responsible custodians of the Charity's land and property; (ii) the way in which the Charity applies its income and the priorities for its expenditure or grants and (iii) following consultation with the Parish Council, the composition and appointment of Trustees.

The majority of the proposed changes come under three categories:

- Changes resulting from the new Charities Act such as: greater freedom to delegate tasks such as the appointment of financial advisors; regulations on the disposal of property and management of conflicts of interest.
- 2. Best practice changes recommended by the solicitors such as procedures for the removal of Trustees; liability and indemnity issues and the power to make decisions via circular resolution.
- 3. Changes in technology such as the ability to hold meetings via teleconference.

Consultation

With regard to consultation, contrary to a report in the February Village News, it has always been the Trustees' intention to consult with the inhabitants of Walberswick before making any changes to the Scheme. However, formal consultation can only commence after a draft Scheme had been submitted to the Charities Commission. The consultation process being followed is:

- 1. Notification via the April Village News
- 2. From 3 April hard copies of the revised Scheme will be available for short-term loan from Mrs J Tibbles, Clerk to the Trustees, Lima Cottage, Ferry Road. You may also obtain an emailed soft copy by calling (01502) 724448.
- 3. A 'drop-in' session with Trustees on **Saturday 25 April 2009** from 10:00 to 12:00 in the Village Hall annexe
- 4. Written submissions are also invited, addressed to the Clerk to Trustees.

The Trustees very much look forward to your feedback on what is an integral part of village life.
