PARISH COUNCIL REPORT 7TH DECEMBER 2009

<u>Planning Matters</u> Approvals were received for the extensions at **Blythreach**, **The Street**, and the new dwelling in the garden of **Troy**, **Churchfield**. Amendments were received for the **Old Corner House**, **The Street** and **Westwood**, **Lodge Road**. The council had no material objections to either.

<u>**Removal of trees</u>** The original application for removal of 20 trees at the rear of **Longroof**, **Leveretts Lane** was withdrawn with an amended version being received. The Council agreed to set up a meeting with the gardener and SCDC to see the trees for themselves.</u>

Planning Services Meeting It was agreed that, as there had been some recent contentious planning applications, that Mr P Ridley, the Head of SCDC Planning Services would be invited to attend a meeting to discuss these and other issues, which would be open to the public, some time in January or February. Further details will be posted on the notice board when they are available.

<u>Viewing Plans</u> From now on should anyone wish to view plans for any relevant planning applications they will be held at the Chairman's house. Please call beforehand to make an appointment to view.

Dates for Parish Council Meetings were agreed for 2010. These will predominately be the **First Monday of each month** except where it falls on a public holiday when it will move to the following Monday. The date for the Annual Parish Meeting will be finalised at the next meeting.

Public Sessions The Parish Council would like to take this opportunity to remind residents that there is a 15-minute public session at the start of all Council meetings (at 7.15), where residents can come and bring any queries, complaints or questions that they may have for the Council. They are more than welcome to stay for the meeting, but may not contribute until the item "Questions from the Public" at the end of the meeting, when they are invited to comment on or question anything they have heard . The meetings are the first Monday of every month, and the full agenda is put on the Stocks Lane & Village Hall Notice Boards & on the Parish Council website <u>www.onesuffolk.co.uk/WalberswickPC</u> at least 3 clear days prior to the meeting.

We have reached an important stage in preparing the Parish Plan: following our drop-in sessions we have a good idea of the issues which Walberswick considers important. Based on this information, we are preparing questionnaires which will be delivered to everybody in the village in the early summer. There is a system of codes in place to ensure that all information resulting from these will be entirely confidential, although additional personal comments can be sent quite separately if the respondent so wishes.

We are keen that everybody has a chance to air their opinions. This means that in addition to villagers, we do need the views of those who run shops or businesses here including people working from home (perhaps on-line) or who are second-home owners, including owners who rent their houses for holiday lets. Because they are not always in the village it is more difficult to contact the members of this large group. If you are unlikely to be in the village to receive the questionnaire, please let us have your email address so that you do not get missed out.

Our volunteers will deliver and collect questionnaires to all households and businesses, but for those often absent or who prefer the convenience, the questionnaires can also be completed on-line.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT, MONDAY 4TH JANUARY 2010

Damage to the Flagpole: the replacement required should be installed in the next couple of weeks. The Plaque to Ruth and Leslie Goodwin is safe and will be re-instated once the new flagpole is in place.

<u>Planning Matters: both</u> the works at Westwood, Lodge Road, and the replacement dwelling at Saltings, Seven Acres Lane, have been approved despite objections from the Parish Council. Applications for works at The Old Corner House, The Street; Lane Corner, Palmers Lane; and The Old Yacht Yard, were all considered and no objections were raised.

Trees at Long Roof, Leveretts Lane. A revised scheme for the number of trees to be cut down had been received and the Parish Council are in the process of setting up a meeting with the Tree Officer to look at this.

The Annual Parish Meeting will take place in the Village Hall on Thursday 15th April 2010. Agendas and notices will be put up around the village nearer the time.

Vandals around the Christmas Tree. Early on Monday 28^{th,} December a load of broken light bulbs, and some broken glasses, were found in Leverett's Lane. On investigation it was discovered that the bulbs had been taken off the village Christmas tree on the Green, around which there were a number of empty drinking glasses. In all 25 light bulbs had to be replaced on the tree. From the number of glasses found (both whole and broken) there must have been at least 4 or 5 idiots involved in this act of drink-influenced vandalism, which must have occurred late evening on Sunday 27th December. If anyone knows who those idiots are, would they please make it clear to them that their behaviour was not acceptable and will not be tolerated.

<u>Carols around the Christmas tree.</u> To finish on a happier note, owing to poor weather the Village Hall became the venue for the annual event. In spite of the weather it was well attended, and thanks are due to all who helped to decorate the hall and organize such an enjoyable evening. Special thanks to Rev. COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

Some time ago the Village News covered the possibility of establishing a Community First Responder scheme in Walberswick. Several people expressed an interest in joining a group but, for one reason or another, things seem to have stalled. There is no doubt about the value of such a scheme, especially in rural areas where ambulances may not arrive in the crucial first eight minutes after a cardiac arrest. The presence of a trained community responder, with the right equipment, to give first aid before the ambulance arrives, greatly increases the chance of survival. Walberswick now has another opportunity to set up a scheme, drawing upon experience in Blythburgh where much of the preliminary work in liaising with the Ambulance Service has been done. Community responders need to be physically fit, able to achieve a satisfactory standard of proficiency after training, and have a full driving licence and access to a car. Each member contributes as much or as little time as they are able. The more responders there are, the better the cover available.

OZ STATISTICS

A total of 500 watched 20 actors on a set designed and constructed by 36. 130 people, aged between 6 and 82, were involved in The Wizard Of Oz: 35 were men, 12 were children - 120 came from the village. We rehearsed for 160 hours. 33 houses were cut out and painted along with 5 huge backdrops. 5 people sewed solidly for 5 months producing 70 costumes and 200 meters of blue gingham ribbon were threaded into the programmes. 50 blank CDs were copied; during 6 performances 327,000 notes were played, mostly correctly, on the keyboard and 30 percussion instruments blown and bashed. There were 150 props, 103 lighting cues and 40 sound cues. A particular thanks to Astrid and her marvellous design team - not only for what they created on the stage but also for the splendid auction which resulted in an invaluable £3,000 contribution towards the Production's costs. "Say No To Sea Eagles Here" signs. The Parish Council had noted these and had contacted Natural England to see why they hadn't been consulted. Natural England had replied stating that the formal consultation had not taken place yet, but that someone will attend the next meeting to discuss the matter further.

Planning Matters: The underground oil tank at **Old Corner House**, and the erection of ground and 1st floor extension at Lane Corner were approved, but Conservation Area Consent was refused for the demolition of the chimney at the same property. New Planning Applications were received for a summerhouse at 18 Manor Close (refused on grounds that footprint was unnecessarily large) and a rear single storey extension at Anchorlea (No objections).

Beech Tree at Alexandra Cottages. There had been much interest in the proposal to cut it down because of fungus infection. It was agreed to obtain a second opinion on the fungus before progressing further.

Footpaths closed for works Suffolk County Council has notified the PC that the paths, originally to be closed until the end of last October, will now remain closed until the end of March, then re-open for the summer. They will then potentially close again next winter for works to continue. The Parish Council are questioning why the work is taking so long. Please see the notice boards for the footpaths affected.



TREE REGULATIONS

Trees in Conservation Areas

All trees in conservation areas are afforded protection (see notes) : written notification to fell or prune a tree has to be given to Suffolk Coastal District Council. If the Council has not responded by the end of six weeks, the proposed tree works can be carried out.

Notes:

1. As a rough guide this applies to trees with a trunk thickness of 3 inches diameter (like a standard size tin of baked beans). If in doubt check with the Council's Arboricultural Officer.

2. If the Council considers a tree (or trees) of significant amenity value a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) can be applied.

Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs)

Formal consent needs to be obtained from the District Council to fell or prune a tree that is the subject of a TPO. Information on the location of TPOs can be obtained from the Council's Arboricultural Officer. Normally replacement planting is required where trees are felled or die. **Development Sites**

A survey report giving details of location, species, etc. of trees within a development site has to be submitted with the planning application.

Felling Licence

In addition to the above, in cases where it is proposed to fell large trees or significant numbers of smaller trees with a timber value, a felling licence from the Forestry Commission may be a requirement. Details from legal www.forestry.gov.uk/england

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING REPORT 29TH MARCH 2010

This meeting was very well attended due to the proposed Agenda item of the land at the rear of Rosemary Cottage.

<u>Sea Eagles</u> Mr Duncan McNiven from Natural England came to speak on the proposed reintroduction of Sea Eagles to the Suffolk Coastline. It was evident that feelings were strong on the subject, and it was established that much more consultation is required..

Beech Tree at Alexandra Cottages <u>A</u> second opinion has confirmed that the tree does indeed have the meripilus fungus, and has to be felled. This fungus affects the roots of the tree and could easily spread to the others. Because the tree had a Tree Preservation Order on it, SCDC have specified in the approval notice that a replacement tree shall be planted which will be protected by the Tree Preservation Order.

Planning Matters: The application for an extension at **Greyroof, Millfield Road,** was turned down. The Parish Council unanimously objected to the proposed second dwelling at **Spindrift, Lodge Road,** and objected in principal to the size of the proposed development at the rear of **Rosemary Cottage.** The Parish Council have not formally objected at this stage as they were aware that an amendment was forthcoming, and an email was sent to the Planners stating that the Parish council would make its formal presentation on receipt of this amendment and subsequent meeting to discuss.

Lottery Terminal Nick Jones had asked the Parish Council for support as Camelot were threatening to take the terminal away. The Council agreed to help and at the time of writing this report it would appear both parties have been successful; however, customers must remember to "use it or lose it".

<u>**Parking Restrictions**</u> Asking for an extension to the parking restrictions had opened a can of worms regarding signage and yellow lines. The Parish Council will do all it can to prevent unnecessary signs in the village.

Many of the diverse groups in the village, including the Common Lands Charity Trust, the Sea Defence Group, the Blyth Estuary Group, The Village Hall Management Committee, the PCC, the Pantomime Group, WI, and the Parish Plan Steering Committee all made presentations. The Parish Council would like to thank everyone for their attendance and interest.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING REPORT, 10TH MAY 2010

The first order of business was to elect the Chairman for the next year. Cllr Alvin Hunt had stated that he did not wish to serve a second year, and proposed Cllr David Webb as Chairman. This was seconded by Cllr Brian Tibbles. Cllr Mandy Aldridge was duly elected as Vice-Chairman. A vote of thanks was made to Cllr Hunt for all he had done as Chairman in a very difficult year.

<u>Parking Restrictions</u>. It was agreed that it was the responsibility of the Parish Council to sort out the issues regarding parking.

Village Green: A working party will be set up to try and eliminate the bald spots on the village green before the summer season.

The proposed development at the rear of **Rosemary Cottage** was discussed again, and in the end it was agreed to object once more to the application in its current form, but to try to work together with all parties to find a suitable solution for the village.

We are now waiting for an "election timetable", and further information regarding the election will be placed on the village notice boards and on the website. ALEXANDRA COTTAGE PLANNING APPLICATION -- THE PARISH COUNCIL'S REPORT

Councillors have recently been bombarded with correspondence regarding the Alexandra Cottage site long after the initial consultation process had been completed.

The PC is only a consultee in the planning process, as are ordinary members of the public, we are **not** the planning authority.

The first and second submissions of this application were discussed at open Parish Council meetings – the only members of the public that were present were the immediate neighbours, who, at the first meeting objected strongly to the style of the houses. The PC relayed these views and objections to Suffolk Coastal, and, as a result, a second application was submitted, by the developers, addressing those concerns. At the second meeting of the PC, the concerned residents were satisfied with the changes, so our response to the application was one of reluctant acceptance, with reservations. We felt that it was difficult to make realistic and sustainable objections on planning grounds. We have never expressed support as implied.

We have been unhappy with the planning process for some considerable time now, which residents would have been aware of had they attended our meetings. We as a Council feel aggrieved that certain residents think we are too willing to let unwanted development happen here – nothing could be further from the truth. We have strongly objected to recent infilling and inappropriate proposals within the village.

Anyone that has actually taken the time to visit the site since it has been cleared will notice that it is surrounded by houses. It is difficult to see how else such a potentially valuable plot could be used. Who would buy it and for what purpose? And it must not be forgotten that for many years this site was overgrown and littered with old buildings and cars.

Anyone who has had any dealings with developers would be surprised that only three houses are being proposed here; using current government guidelines, several more could have been fitted in. The proposed plot sizes are similar to those in Manor Close.

As the democratically elected body in the village, it is for the PC to act in accordance with the proper consultation process and we should not allow ourselves to be deflected by people or groups who appear to be pursuing their own agenda. If those people wish to pursue conflicts of their own making, they are perfectly entitled to do so. The PC cannot become embroiled with personal arguments against the District Council.

We would suggest that if those concerned wish to lobby the Parish Council in future they should attend our meetings at the appropriate times, and/or write with their concerns, to the Parish Clerk.

If this Council becomes highly implicated with an inordinate number of complaints against Suffolk Coastal, we could lose all credibility as a consultee in the planning process.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2010

The Chairman, Mr Alvin Hunt, stated that there had been major changes in the Parish Council personnel over the last 12 months, firstly with the arrival of the new Clerk, Mischi Vernetti, whom he thanked for doing such a good job in taking over the administration of the Council. She had been on several courses in that time as part of regular training as well as working towards obtaining quality status for the Parish Council. Secondly, sadly, two of our councillors, Maddy Dabbs & Robin Buncombe had resigned. The vacancies will be filled either by election or by co-option.

He thanked his fellow councillors for all the hard work & dedication shown over the previous 12 months. Particular thanks were paid to David Webb, for showing great support as Vice Chairman, as well as working tirelessly for the village. He also congratulated Wally Webb for being awarded a certificate from the High Sheriff of Suffolk for his contribution to the community over many years. He also thanked Kay Ungless for her work in setting up, and updating the Walberswick website.

He reported that the Parish Plan Steering Committee was making good progress & thanked the Chairman, Bill Ungless for his efforts & also to Kay, who does much of the administrative work.

Good news on the river defences & harbour front. It was likely that the north wall of the harbour was going to be repaired using the method preferred by all the interested parties. Planning permission had been obtained for the repair of the river walls. He praised the relentless efforts of Richard Steward, who had worked tirelessly. Offshore dredging still seemed to be a controversial subject; the pro-dredging lobby claiming that it was not affecting our shoreline whilst other interested groups were claiming that erosion of our beaches was taking place. The Parish Council had written to John Gummer expressing its concern. The possible introduction of sea eagles was also very controversial. Anyone who came to the April Parish Council meeting will have seen Mr McNiven of English Nature face a grilling from councillors & members of the public.

The Parish Council had joined the Sizewell Parishes Liaison Group. This is to ensure that we keep in touch with progress & share in any infrastructure benefits that may be derived from the possible construction of Sizewell C.

The new play equipment at the playing field had been installed & looked very smart. It is proving a popular place for mums to take their children. The Chairman thanked Vivien & Mischi for organising the fund raising & general administration which enabled the project to come to fruition.

The application to bring forward the parking restrictions to include April seems to have opened a can of worms. Apparently our current yellow line system, which was set up in 1995, did not comply with current regulations. Unfortunately, the proposed SCC replacement system includes 44 signs in the main street. The Council was still hoping to avoid this.

The threatened closure of the terminal at the Tuck Shop had been averted. The Parish Council responded to Camelot with a convincing argument that this facility should be retained, and the introduction of the three-wheelie bin system appears to have been successful.

Our biggest problem at present was, as usual, planning. Permission has been granted on the site behind Alexandra Cottage. The Parish Council would have preferred the site not to have been developed. However, to have only three houses proposed for such a large site is as good as we could have expected, given the current pressure on local authorities for more homes. However strongly we feel about it, Walberswick cannot be exempt from development. The proposed development behind Rosemary Cottage was also proving to be controversial. The Parish Council has objected to the initial proposals for the site. He stated that some people in the village wanted to object to every single planning application. To do this would result in the Parish Council losing all credibility with the Suffolk Coastal Planning Department. There were some who do not seem to realise this as they waste already overstretched officers' valuable time demanding long & complex answers to their voluminous letters. He had a final word to the critics of the Parish Council. He said that Walberswick had a very hard working set of Councillors & that the continuous stream of written & whispered criticism by a small minority of villagers was having a demoralising effect. He pointed out that there was a by-election coming up & also a Parish Council election next May. He hoped these people would put up for election.

On a positive note he said that everyone agreed that the Wizard of Oz was a big success. Congratulations to Julia & her really professional team for a wonderful production.

BECOME A RESPONDER



FLOOD RISK MAPS - HOUSE INSURANCE

In assessing the flood risk to homes most insurance companies use the National Flood Risk Assessment (NaFRA) data produced by the Environment Agency. The current NaFRA map shows all lowlying properties in Walberswick in a high risk category, even where properties are protected by the flood defence banks.

Following a request from the Parish Council, the Environment Agency will update the NaFRA data that cover Walberswick. There will now be two flood risk cells covering the low-lying part of the village. Cell Two will cover properties within the protection of the post-1953 defences (a 1 in 200 chance of flooding each year), i.e. low risk. Properties without the protection of the flood defence banks, i.e. those at the bottom of the Lea, Marsh End Flats and Old Vicarage Cottage, fall into Cell One which indicates there is higher flood risk (1 in 5 chance of flooding).

The Environment Agency has not given a time scale for the update, but it is hoped it will not take too long. Once it is complete those with properties in Cell Two should find it easier dealing with home insurance; unfortunately this is unlikely to apply to those in Cell One. To check if the update has been made go to the E.A's flood risk map on the internet and type in your post code. David Webb

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING REPORT 7TH JUNE 2010

The Chairman introduced the two new Councillors, Mrs Rita Woodcraft and Mr Chris Hosea, who were duly elected to the Parish Council by way of an uncontested election. Despite residents calling for an election to be held, only Mrs Woodcraft and Mr Hosea put their papers in to Suffolk Coastal, so as there were two seats available they were elected. The hope is that all will join the Parish Council in wishing them well and support them in their new roles.

Planning Matters: The application for Manor House was approved, even though the Parish Council had objected to it. The Parish Council had no objections to a new garage at Kermont, The Street and various alterations at Tygwyn, the Lea, but were most concerned that the proposal to add external insulation and external render to the outside of 9 Church Lane had been re-submitted. The Clerk wrote and objected most strongly to this application and also copied the letter to Flagship Housing in the hope it would help.

Annual Audit: This has been completed and sent off to the External Auditors; anyone wishing to inspect the accounts should contact the Clerk.

Parking Restriction Signage: It appears the Highways Department are planning to change the signage to comply with regulations, but they seem aware that the Village want as few extra signs as possible. The PC are planning to meet with Highways to see where they propose to put them.

Vandalism on the Beach: Recently a gathering on the beach vandalised the lifebelts yet again and ripped down Natural England signs. It took councillors and others over an hour to clear up all the broken glass. The police claim to have an eye on this sort of thing, but if any residents see anything suspicious please contact one of the Parish Councillors.

Potential Development in the Village: In light of the rows over this topic, it is clear that there is a need to carry out a new Housing Needs Survey. At present the PC are taking advice and discussing how best to carry this out, but it will most likely take the form of a survey/questionnaire delivered to individual residents to complete. It is important to update this in order to maintain a sustainable future for the next generation in the village.



PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS 5TH 14TH & 21ST JULY 2010

The Council Meeting on the 5th was postponed, due to the Clerk's illness. It was rescheduled for Wednesday 14th July, the first date when all Councillors were available. As the notice went up on the notice board a few hours later than it should have, two people complained to the Monitoring Officer at SCDC and the Council therefore could not legally transact any business. It was re-scheduled again for Wednesday 21st July, with the Agenda being posted on the Notice Boards, 3 clear days prior, thus giving the proper notice. **Planning Matters:**

Permission was granted by Suffolk Coastal District Council for the applications at **Millcroft**, **Millfield Road; Kermont**, **The Street; and Tygwyn**, **The Lea.** Permission was refused for the proposal to render the outside of 9 Church Lane.

The Parish Council had no objections to the new applications at **The Anchor Hotel; The Old Corner House, The Street; Westwick, Lodge Road;** and **Hoistwood House, The Street.** The Council had no objections to the retrospective application from **Marshway**, but the Clerk was asked to point out once again that they were against the concept of retrospective planning application: one Councillor commented that to his **kn**owledge nothing had ever been taken down because retrospective planning had been refused! The Parish Council objected to the application for an indoor swimming pool at **Westwood, Lodge Road.** While it was accepted that objecting on Environmental grounds was not a valid planning concern, it was an important issue, and the Clerk was asked to obtain further information as to where the plant and ventilation ducts would be placed. Once again the Parish Council voted by 3 votes to 2 to object to the current proposal at **Rosemary Cottage**, on the grounds that the proposal contains too many houses for the site.

Other business

SCC had provided the Clerk with information of a timer system that can be put on the streetlights at Adams Lane. The Clerk will be writing to all residents to get their views on this. Natural England had written to the Parish council announcing that they were pulling out of the programme to re-introduce Sea Eagles along the coast, but stated that the RSPB were still committed to the project. It was agreed that the Clerk would send our concerns regarding this directly to the RSPB.
