PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 6TH DECEMBER 2010

<u>New Councillor</u>: the Chairman introduced Mr Nick Crocker, who had been the only person to put his papers forward after some residents had called for an election. He signed the Declaration of Office and was welcomed to the meeting.

<u>Suffolk County Council</u>: County Cllr Mr Rae Leighton explained to the meeting about the proposed budget cuts at the Council and stated there would not be a rise in Council Tax, which is good news for all; however the New Strategic Direction, in which the Council are looking to others to provide services they currently carry out, will impact every household. The Parish Council will endeavour to keep everyone informed, but for those interested there is more information on both the SCC Website <u>www.suffolk.gov</u> and the SCDC Website <u>www.suffolkcoastal.gov</u>

<u>Planning Matters:</u> Permission was granted for the extension at Greyroof, Millfield Road, and the Parish Council had no objections to the extension proposed at Driftwood, Church Lane.

<u>Precept:it</u> was unanimously agreed that this year it would remain at the same level as last year, which roughly equates to a charge of £22.00 for a Band D property.

<u>Digital Switchover:</u> we have been notified that the switchover for the Tacolneston Transmitter will take place 9 November 2011. For more information either call FREE on 0800 40 85 900, email on info@helpscheme.co.uk, or by post to FREEPOST Switchover Help Scheme.

The Parish Council formally adopted a <u>Public Participation in Council Meetings Protocol</u>. This has been placed on the noticeboards and will take effect from January.

<u>Meetings for 2011</u> will continue to be the first Monday in each month where possible, with full Parish Council elections being held in May, and the Annual Parish Meeting on Thursday 14 April. Dates and Agendas will be posted in the normal places nearer the time.

The Parish Council would like to take this opportunity to thank those in the village who have continued to support them during this sometimes difficult year, and look forward to continuing support for the work they are trying to do in the future.

LONG-LOST VILLAGE SIGN

The village sign that now stands by the green is a replica of the original that stood at the entrance to the village just to the west of Adams Lane. The original sign was stolen at Easter in either 1984 or 1985. I am pleased to say that the original sign has now been found.

I have been contacted (thanks to the Parish web site) by a couple who, some time ago, purchased the original sign at a garage sale in the London suburbs, and had no idea it was a village sign until last summer. Travelling up the A12 towards Norfolk, they spotted the signpost for Walberswick and decided to visit. In their words they *"fell in love with the place"*, noted the replacement sign, and realised it was virtually identical to the one in their possession.

The couple, Mr. and Mrs Newstead, have said they will be very sorry to part with the sign but believe it should be returned to its rightful home. The Parish Council will now liaise with them to arrange for the return of the sign. It should be possible to make quite an event of the occasion – so watch this space for details. **David Webb**

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 10 JANUARY 2011

The first meeting of the New Year was well attended. County Cllr Rae Leighton spoke about the inevitable cuts in services that would happen at County Council level in order to "Balance the Budget" - but he stated that exactly which services would go was still under discussion and he would keep the Parish Council and Village updated.

Broadband Speeds Our new Councillor, Nick Crocker, is doing some research into improving the broadband speeds in the village. He also suggested that a "substantial community project" could bring the village together by harnessing the wide range of skills available, and potentially create an iconic legacy for future generations. So if anyone reading this has any ideas, please contact the Clerk, or any of the Councillors.

<u>Planning Matters</u> There were none to be discussed this meeting. For those concerned about the felling of the Beech Tree at the entrance to the Alexandra Cottage site: the Parish Council obtained a second opinion as to whether the tree could be saved, and it was clear this was not possible. We have asked that it be replaced with something of a compatible size.

NATURE NOTES

Common Volunteers

Many thanks to the volunteers who have again done some most useful work clearing footpaths and Silver Birch saplings on the heath. We will start work again next September.

Caterpillars of the Brown-Tailed Moth. It has been reported that these pests are present in bramble bushes near the beach huts, so they could be elsewhere in the village. Up to 2000 caterpillars overwinter in small silken tents on bushes and then emerge in spring to eat buds and leaves of trees and shrubs.. They are between 7mm and 38 mm in length, dark brown in colour with a white stripe down each side and two red/orange spots at the tail end of the back. **Beware: these caterpillars are covered in up to two million barbed hairs that can cause an irritant rash.** (Treat with calamine lotion or antihistamine cream)

The best time to tackle these pests is in the winter by cutting out and burning their tents. **Protective cloth**ing must be worn. Look on the Internet for further details.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 7^{1H} FEBRUARY 2011

<u>Planning Matters:</u> The final "permission granted" letter was received for the land North of Alexandra Cottage; and permission was also granted for the extension and alterations at Driftwood, Church Lane. New Applications had been received for Fishers Garage and Bunbury Cottage and the Councillors had no objections to either.

It appeared <u>Suffolk County Council</u> were considering the suggestion of a sluice at the A12 at Blythburgh, instead of raising the road, which was a positive step. The <u>Environment Agency</u> had been told about the fencing on the beach, and enquiries are being made into the possibility of steps being put alongside the sea wall at the end of the footpath by the allouments.

The Royal Wedding: As stated in last month's Village News, the Village Hall Management Committee are planning to show the ceremonies on the big screen in the Hall, and the Parish council would like to arrange some other events for children in the afternoon. There have been suggestions of an Art Competition, which would be judged on the day, and some sports on the Village Green. Cllrs Rita Woodcraft and Mandy Aldridge are liaising with the Village Hall Committee.

Parish Plan: Peter Byrne gave an update on the status of the Plan on behalf of the Committee: this will be available as part of the full minutes. The Parish Council asked Mr Byrne to convey their thanks to the Committee for all their hard work.

<u>The National Grid</u> are asking for the public's views on its approach to undergrounding electricity cables. Anyone interested can complete the questionnaire at <u>www.nationalgridundergrounding.com</u> or call the project information number at **0800 319 6175**.

High Speed Internet Access: Cllr Nick Crocker reported to the meeting his findings on this subject. A copy of his positioning paper has been posted to the PC website at <u>www.onesuffolk.co.uk/walberswickpc</u>. There is a likelihood of Walberswick being disadvantaged compared to other areas in regard to the future provision of internet speed and availability. Given there are likely to be significant social and environmental gains from having universal access in addition to the more obvious benefits, this is a cause for concern. Some initial feasibility work is being undertaken to seek potential solutions, and Cllr Crocker now needs to form a small team to take the project forward. FROM THE TEAM RECTOR

There will be five Lent lectures on Sunday evenings at 6pm at the United Reformed Church in Southwold. The title of the series is *The Changing Place of the Church in the World*. It is true that the church has changed during our lifetimes, and I often hear comments that express regret at this. The truth however is that the church is always changing, and that change is necessary for life. Our lecture series will look at the changing church.

13 March: Jonathan Herbert will reflect on how the church has changed during our lifetime. Jonathan is a member of the Pilsdon religious community. The community was established in 1958 in Kent with the aim of "the advancement of the Christian religion by the formation of a community of people who endeavour to live together as one household in order to welcome people in need, and be united in love and prayer according to the precepts of the Christian Gospels."

20 March: Revd Charles Croll will offer insights into the contemporary life of the church in Zimbabwe and Revd Paul Daltry will speak about our link Diocese in Tanzania. They will show how the church in Africa compares to the church in England at this time. Charles is the minister of Southwold URC. Revd Daltry is the Diocesan Link Officer for Tanzania, and works as a pioneer minister in Ipswich.

27 March: Bishop Clive will speak about the different types and expressions of Church that exist in Suffolk, and will offer his insights on what the future Christian church in England might look like.

3 April: Dr Claire Daunton will offer an historical perspective on how the church shaped community life in a town such as Southwold in the past. Dr Daunton is a medieval historian at Trinity Hall in Cambridge.

10 April: How a personal Christian faith has changed the life of one man. Brian Gault is one of 480 survivors of the drug Thalidomide that emerged in Britain during the 1960s. Brian was born with no arms. Originally from Northern Ireland, he now travels widely in the UK sharing his story and experience, and offering real encouragement to his hearers. Brian, through his work, supports those who care for children in need in Brazil. He is also an inspiration to non-Christians, so you might like to invite friends to come and hear him.

Through this series of lectures I hope that we will be encouraged in our faith, enthused by the faithfulness of our God, and inspired to look forward into the future with a fresh energy and commitment. **Revd Simon Pitcher, Team Rector**

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 7 MARCH 2011

<u>Planning Matters</u>: No objections were found for Marshview, Moorside Cottage and Marshway, but there were objections to the adding of another property at Primrose Cottage. There was also concern that the new proposed cart lodge at Lane Corner could easily be turned into a separate dwelling and it was suggested that SCDC be asked to put a condition on the application to prevent this happening.

WILLIAM 'TERRY' BALL (1931-2011)

Terry was a very popular member of our community, and the news of his sudden death sent a shock-wave through the village. He loved good conversation and was an engaging raconteur, his stories always replete with his particular brand of dry humour. He made painting visits to Walberswick in the 1970s, and finally settled here with Christine in 1999.

In earlier life Terry had an interesting and unusual career. He was a full-time art student for eight years; the last three of these were at the Royal College of Art, where he studied alongside some of the major artistic figures of his generation (Riley, Auerbach, Kossoff, etc.) and was tutored by distinguished luminaries of the time. He painted prolifically all his life, but took an unusual turn after the RCA with a long spell in Palestine and Jordan, drawing and recording ancient monuments. In the 1960s he was part of the team working on the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and until recently was undertaking freelance work making meticulous cutaway drawings of castles and other ancient buildings for guide books etc. (he called this 'the day job'). He was also a Fellow of the Society of Antiquaries.



A few years ago my mother made some elderflower wine. She was so excited that she opened her bottles and drank it without waiting long enough for the wine to properly mature. It tasted horrible, because she, encouraged by the whole family, acted in haste!

During May this year the church celebrates the season of Easter. Easter is not just one day, but a season of 40 days from Easter Day until Ascension Day, which this year falls on 2 June. In the Bible seasons of 40 days or 40 years occur for example in the story of the Exodus, when the people of God travelled from Egypt to the Promised Land. Noah's Ark floated for 40 days and 40 nights. 40 is a symbol of completeness. It takes time to understand what belief in God might mean for us. It takes time in the Bible for great things to happen. Understanding the purposes of God requires time and patience, prayer and reflection. There are rarely instant answers.

Allowing ourselves time to think, to prepare and to respond gives us an opportunity for wisdom and maturity. No one ever worked out the meaning of life, the universe and everything in five minutes. The 40 days of Easter is a complete time to work out what the message of new, risen and different life might mean for each of us.

The following year my mother made some more elderberry wine, and this time patience was rewarded. We had bottles of delicious, fine tasting wine that were the fruit of mature waiting. Simon Pitcher

Various amendments to Plots 1 & 2 on the land to the rear of **Alexandra Cottage** had been received and for the most part no objections could be found. However the proposed glass window on Plot 1 was considered too large and clearly overlooking the neighbouring property; it was agreed to make reference to this in the objections.

Broadband Connection Cllr Nick Crocker gave an update on the situation: a couple of residents had come forward to offer assistance and it was hoped to further enhance this group after the Parish Plan meeting. There appear to be a few options which all need thorough investigation, and Cllr Crocker agreed to carry on with this and to keep the Parish Council fully updated.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 4TH JULY 2011

<u>Mobile Police Station</u>: PCSO Newson attended the meeting and stated that the Mobile Station visited the village each month. He also reminded the Parish Council that there was no Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator in the village. This is an important role which keeps the police and PCSOs informed of any issues of concern. If anyone is interested in taking up this role, please contact the Chairman or one of the other Councillors.

<u>Planning Matters:</u> Permission has been granted for the amendments to Plots 1, 2 and 3, Alexandra Cottage, but the Parish Council are going to try and contact the developer to see if the colour of the "security fencing" around the site could be changed to something a little more sympathetic and in keeping! With regard to the application to vary conditions imposed on permitted development rights at Plot 1 at Alexandra Cottage, it was felt that as the North Area Sub-Committee had imposed the restrictions they should remain in place.

No objections were found to the demolition and replacement of a bathroom at **The Anchor**; and the construction of a dormer with oak French doors (replacing a roof light) to open on to a new oak and glass balcony at **Hidden House**.

Open Gardens Day: The Parish Council extended congratulations to all those associated with this very successful event.

Street Lights in Adams Lane: Suffolk County Council have confirmed that the street lights in Adams Lane will be fitted with the "intelligent light" systems early in December. The lights will come on automatically when needed but can be programmed to go off at a predetermined time. Any residents of Adams Lane and Nightingale Close who want further information should contact the Clerk.

<u>New Clerk to Council</u>: The position of Clerk has been offered to and accepted by **Mrs Jane Gomm**. We will work closely together this next month to ensure a smooth handover; Mrs Gomm's contact details will be published on the notice boards, and the website changed over the next few weeks.

Local Recycling Centres: The recycling centres in Leiston and Lowestoft will remain under the same management. The centre at Southwold will close on 15 August and reopen on 22 August under new management. From 22 August fees will be charged at Southwold.

<u>Planning matters:</u> Planning permission has been granted for the following: a kitchen and utility extension at Hoist Wood House, The Street; single storey rear and side extensions at Seven Acres, Lodge Road; an external oil tank and boiler at 3 Church Lane; a porch at Short Lane House, Short Lane; the demolition and replacement of a bathroom at The Anchor. An application had been made to retain external render to walls at Little Meadow, The Street. The Council have objected to this application as it was felt that, because the work had already been carried out, there was no chance for the Council or members of the public to made constructive criticisms or voice their comments.

<u>Sea Defences:</u> The cost of repairs and new facilities to the north dock wall at the harbour are to be met by Waveney District Council and the European Fisheries Fund and work should commence in the Autumn.

Lights which detrimentally affect views of the night sky: One of the Councillors mentioned that some of the security lights erected, particularly in the Street, affect views of the night sky. Would householders please try to position or screen them so that the light is not spread into the sky.

FROM THE TEAM RECTOR

Archbishop William Temple once said that the Church is the only organisation that exists for those who are not its members. What he meant was that the Church was called to be a community that serves others and not itself. Jesus did not see his life work as being the foundation of a global institution, but rather he gave his life so that all and every person might come to know the love of God for each of us. The mission of the church in each generation is to make the love of Christ known in our own time and place.

Working out what this means at local and parish level requires a flexible and imaginative approach. In Walberswick there is the monthly lunch, which is given as an act of love and service by some dedicated and generous people for the sake of the whole community. Those who provide this lunch are a real blessing, and deserve our thanks. The Church is open each day so that anyone who feels drawn can find peace and quiet for a few precious moments. In theory Church Wardens are elected by the whole community, not just by church members, so that the voice of the community is heard and understood in the life of the local church, and so that the church is part of local life.

In recent weeks the church tower has been open for visitors, and it will be again on 10 September, when the Historic Churches Trust sponsored bike ride takes place. Many visitors enjoyed the climb and the view from the top. From 31 August until 4 September there will be an art exhibition in the church. This is not about turning the church into a shop, but is about making the church available for the whole of community life, so that both church and community can be enriched by working together. PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 5 SEPTEMBER 2011

<u>Agendas and Minutes</u>: The Council has agreed to put the agendas and approved minutes on the Council's website again.

<u>Planning matters</u>: Planning permission has been granted for the following: the construction of dormer doors to open on to a balcony at first floor level at **Hidden House**, **The Green**; and to retain the painted render at **Little Meadow**, **The Street**.

The Council also considered four planning applications and/or applications for conservation area consent. It had no objections to the proposal to demolish an old workshop to the rear of **Bunbury Cottage, The Street** as it appeared to be in a dangerous condition. They objected or had very serious concerns about the other applications which were: **Rosemary Cottage, The Street**, where it was proposed to demolish some side and rear extensions and remove a dormer window, and replace them with two dormer windows, two roof lights and two side extensions; **Tow's Cabin, Ferry Road**, where it was proposed to demolish the existing dwelling and replace it with a two storey dwelling; **Sea House, 2 The Terrace**, where it was proposed to insert a dormer window into the roof.

Emergency and non-emergency telephone calls to the police: From October in Suffolk and Norfolk, people should continue to dial 999 for emergency calls to the police and dial 101 for non emergency calls. This system will, in time, cover the whole country.

Beach Clean: The next beach clean will be held on Sunday 16 October. Please look out for posters giving more information. Gloves and bags will be provided to volunteers.

<u>Waste Collections</u>: After the review by Suffolk Coastal District Council, it has been confirmed that there will be no changes to the dates and times of collections in Walberswick.

The bridge over the creek near East Point: The Environment Agency has informed the Council it intends to demolish the bridge as it is in need of repair and because, according to the Environment Agency, there are no public rights of way over it. The Council is opposed to this and is making strong objections. If you feel the same you should telephone 01473 706736 or write to Louise Hall, Asset System Management (Norfolk and Suffolk) Team Member 1, Environment Agency, Iceni House, Cobham Road, Ipswich, Suffolk IP3 9JE, making your feelings known and setting out why you think the bridge should remain. You need to act before Friday 28 October.

THE HERITAGE HUT

Built as a Congregation Chapel on Parish Council land, it has also been used as the Village School, a Workingmen's Club, an antiques store and the local HQ of the St. John's Ambulance Brigade before becoming a Suffolk Coasts and Heaths Visitor Centre. In 1956 the St. John's Ambulance Brigade signed a 99-year lease (to occupy the land) with Walberswick Parish Council and the balance of this lease was transferred to Suffolk County Council (SCC) when it purchased the building from the St. John's in 1979. Until recently the building has been used as a Visitor Centre by Suffolk Coast and Heaths AONB, manned by local volunteers.

Current Position

Suffolk Coasts and Heaths are no longer able to operate the visitor centre and as part of SCC's proposals to divest parks and recreational sites to local communities, SCC has agreed to transfer ownership of the building to the Parish Council or another local community organisation. It has been decided to ask SCC to transfer ownership to Walberswick Common Lands Charity; the reasons for this are (a) the Charity already has experience of buildings ownership, and (b) it maintains a double lock on the future use of the building (the Parish Council owns the land and the Charity will own the building).

The future

Following transfer of ownership it is proposed the building continue as a visitor centre, but with a more local focus than has been the case recently. A Visitor Centre Management Group will be established, initially consisting of 2 representatives each from the Parish Council, the Common Lands Charity and the Walberswick History Group. Both Suffolk Coasts and Heaths and Natural England desire to have some exposure within the remodelled visitor centre and have offered assistance. The aim is to have the visitor centre re-opened in time for next year's holiday season, once again manned by local volunteers.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 3 OCTOBER 2011

<u>Planning matters</u>: The Council did not object to a planning application to construct a small wall outside Fishers Garage.

<u>The Post Office</u> has started to consult on plans for mutualisation which the Council will make comments on at its next meeting. If you wish to comment details can be found at <u>http://discuss.bis.uk/pomutualisation/</u>

The mobile library service is being reviewed by Suffolk County Council and it has suggested reducing its fortnightly visit to the village to a monthly or four-weekly visit and reducing the number of stops made to one in the village. The Council accepted a four-weekly visit which would retain the visit on the same day of the week, but objected to the number of stops being reduced to one as this would mean many people would have to drive to the library stop and in the summer would find it difficult to park.

The Government's Draft National Planning Policy Framework was considered and comments were made to the Secretary of State concerning the definition of "sustainable" in the document and expressing concern over the apparent dropping of the current presumption in favour of conservation and concern that countryside not covered by specific designations such as Heritage Coast or National Park will become more vulnerable to development.

Footpath 36 between Tinkers House and 900m west of the Bailey bridge is being closed for up to six months to allow flood defence work to proceed.

Freedom of Information Act Requests for Information: During the course of August the Clerk had worked approximately 83 hours (that is, 43 hours more than her contracted time) of which 45 hours were spent dealing with requests for information from a small number of people in the village. During September she spent about 30 hours in dealing with requests for information, again requiring her to work many hours over her contracted time. In September she dealt with 65 requests and she is also dealing with the Information Commissioner's Office on eleven outstanding complaints from the same group of people. Many but not all the requests have been outstanding for some time and it is hoped that new requests will reduce in number in the future.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 7 NOVEMBER 2011

Planning matters: Suffolk Coastal District Council has given conservation area consent to the demolition of a workshop to the rear of **Bunbury Cottage**, **The Street**. In respect of plot 1, to the north of **Alexandra Cottage**, it has refused permission to vary a condition which restricts permitted development rights for extensions, alterations and outbuildings of the proposed house. The Parish Council raised no objection to the application for the retention of a boiler flue on a barn at **The Stables**, **The Street**. It also had no objection to an application to erect extensions and alterations at **Little Meadow**, **The Street**.

<u>Councillors Crocker and Aldridge have resigned</u>, due to pressure of commitments outside the village. The Council will miss both of them.

<u>The Post Office</u> has asked for suggestions on reinstating a service in Walberswick. If there is a business in the village that feels it could host a *Post Office Essentials* service in its premises, and would like more information, please contact Wendy Hamilton at 07753905010 or wendy.hamilton@postoffice.co.uk

The Council's Communications: A protocol on styles and methods was agreed, and will be available shortly on the website and notice boards.

<u>Sat navs</u>: it is possible to correct these via a website, to prevent them directing HGVs along unsuitable roads such as Short Lane. If there are any others in the village please let Cllr Hunt know before 15 January, after which he will be making the corrections.

Saxmundham and Framlingham Safer Neighbourhood Team: The village needs a representative to attend the tasking meeting held every two months. This meeting with the local police discusses issues of local importance. If you are able to volunteer please contact the Clerk.

The Council is statutorily obliged to deal with these matters and it is now posing a serious financial problem for the Council. The cost to the Council between July and October has been £1,093.
