

SAVE ON HEATING OIL ...

Buy through a community bulk buying scheme! Community Action Suffolk (CAS) can offer domestic households an average yearly saving of £74 on heating oil, and higher volume users, such as community groups and rural businesses, an average yearly saving of £181. The heating oil is purchased in bulk twice a month (once in December) and deliveries are planned to provide an environmental benefit, with one tanker making a single trip to several customers in a village on the same day. Individual orders can also be made if a bulk deadline is missed. The scheme provides a hassle free process and membership is open to all, starting at just £20 per year with the option to place orders online, by email, by post or by phone. LETTER FROM THE OLM (retired)

Dear Friends,

I suspect that for most of us it will be a mixture of both and we also wonder if 2016 will be any different? Or do we look with expectation as Alfred, Lord Tennyson did in his poem In Memoriam:

Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring, happy bells, across the snow: The year is going, let him go; Ring out the false, ring in the true.

In truth none of us really knows what 2016 will bring us. St James in his New Testament letter tells his readers, 'you do not know what tomorrow will bring', let alone for a whole year! Anxious about what lies ahead? I commend to the words of the Old Testament Psalmist, 'Trust in the Lord with all your heart...and he will make straight your paths.'



IT IS RISEN! PARISH COUNCIL REVIVED!

Walberswick Parish Council, whose members resigned en masse, is able to make decisions again, with the appointment of three new councillors. The council lost six of its seven members in 2012 after it was "bombarded" with requests for information. Raymond Catchpole, one of the new councillors, said: "The intention is to draw a line under past problems." It followed a campaign co-ordinated by, he says: A "tiny minority" of residents. Between 2009 and 2011, the council received almost 500 Freedom of Information Act requests, mainly from a group of four villagers who were unhappy with the way a housing development had been considered and the way the council operated. This put the council under financial pressure and since the 2012 resignations, the number of councillors has fluctuated between one and six, and stood at two before the new appointments. The parish requires at least three councillors at meetings to make it quorate (able to make binding decisions). Suffolk Council District Council (SCDC) has overseen the appointment of the three new members to get the parish council functioning again, although none of them lives in the village. Mr Catchpole is joined by fellow district councillor Philip Dunnett and Paul Widdowson, who serves on Halesworth Town Council. Mr Catchpole added: "The intention is to be temporary councillors, and we need villagers to come forward for this parish council to have a future. If they don't, then replacing it with a parish meeting might be an answer, similar to the one they have in Dunwich." A parish meeting is a meeting of villagers, rather than elected councillors, and has fewer responsibilities and only requires a chairman, treasurer and clerk. Tasks facing the newly-quorate Walberswick Parish Council include setting a new parish precept and filling the vacancy for a clerk.

RESURRECTION OF THE RUINS UPDATE

Work on restoring the ruins of St Andrews Church is progressing to schedule, helped by the relatively mild weather. The work has also thrown up some questions about the history of the various building phases, especially in the Chancel area, where clear differences have been revealed as the internal plaster has largely fallen off the walls.

Our generous main funder, Historic England, has kindly agreed to fund a local archaeologist to assess the ruins to advise the architect Nick Jacob and Hoggs builders how best to carry out the repairs.'

It will also help us in our interpretation of the ruins In case you are wondering, it is too early to say at this stage when the scaffolding will be taken down. But the PCC have some exciting plans for officially celebrating the re-opening (if that is the correct term) of the ruins once completed, so keep an eye out on the notice boards after Easter.

DEFENCELESS? ROBINSONS' & TOWN MARSHES

The Environment Agency has announced that it is abandoning the project to raise and strengthen the river wall between the Ferry Hut and the Bailey Bridge. This decision has been blamed on increased costs as a result of the clay in the marshes being unsuitable for construction of the banks without expensive treatment. This is bad news for flood protection in The Lea, the long-term preservation of this important access to the Village and the viability of Southwold Harbour. The Blyth Estuary Group and the Charity are working together to persuade the Agency to carry out spot strengthening of the wall in the areas where it is most vulnerable to a breach and to bring the top to a constant level of 2.5 metres OD, the height of the bank at the Ferry Hut. The compound in Ferry Road is being removed,

although the fencing will stay in place until the

grass has re-established.

WALBERSWICK COMMON LANDS CHARITY

The Trustees are monitoring the possible sale of the **Blythburgh Estate**, as it is our largest neighbour. We have registered our interest with the selling agents as a potential conservation partner for prospective purchasers. There are three aims to this move; (i) aligning conservation objectives, (ii) combining flood protection strategies and (iii) encouraging 'friendly' farming practices adjoining the Village. Time will tell if this comes to anything. If it did, we would consult with the Village before taking definitive steps.

In May, land to the rear of Church Lane was entered via the Common by clearance contractors working for the landowner. The contractors had no right to do this and did not obtain the prior consent of the Charity. The landowner has been reminded of the obligation to protect habitat and no further access has been authorised. The boundary is being surveyed, following which we will consider fencing. While this goes against the principle of enclosing the Common, it would prevent unauthorised access.

At the presentation by Village groups, held on 21 April, we explained the increased scrutiny that the Charity was under, not all of it well intentioned. As a consequence the Trustees need to ensure that they protect the Charity by sticking to the rules laid down by our Scheme and the Charities Act. This has highlighted ambiguity over some traditional practices, such as offering advantageous terms to residents. To resolve this ambiguity the Trustees have obtained legal advice and sought clarification from the Charity Commission. Our objective being to retain the status-quo if at all possible. We hope to be in a position to present the outcome of this work in the Autumn, most likely via a public meeting. Amanda Erlenbach, Trustee, has kindly taken on the role of overseeing the Charity's conservation work under the stewardship agreement with Natural England. Her aim is to ensure that we meet our obligations during the final two years of the agreement. Durrants have been engaged to provide professional advice and support Mandy in this important work. 


