LETTER FROM THE OLM (retired)

Dear Friends.

What is it about celebrating a New Year, after all the academic year begins September/October, the football season now starts in August, and the Church calendar starts in Advent? The German novelist, Thomas Mann, probably got it right when he wrote:

'Time has no division to mark its passage, there is never a thunderstorm or blare of trumpets to announce the beginning of a new month or year. Even when a new century begins it is only we mortals who ring bells and fire off pistols.'

Does it feel any different ,the following day after we have celebrated the arrival of another 1st January? Perhaps, we will have made new resolutions (or the same ones as last year) but how long will they last? Or should we as Christians, have a different outlook as far as New Year is concerned, should we not celebrate every new day that God, our heavenly father, gives us?

I suspect that that is what the hymn writer, John Keble, had in mind when he wrote the following words:

Dear Friends,

It will not be long before we find ourselves in the season of Lent. Lent is the 40 day period prior to Easter that reminds us of the 40 days Christ spent in the wilderness before he began his public ministry. During those 40 days Christ was tempted by the devil, but resisted that temptation. Traditionally Christians use the season of Lent as a time of fasting and prayer in preparation for Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday 1st March, and there

will be a service of Holy Communion with ashing at 10.00 in St Andrews.

Within the Sole Bay Team of churches we usually offer a Lent Bible study group, which in previous years I have held in my Vicarage in Southwold. This year however I am pleased to announce a new approach. On Thursday afternoons in March between 2.30pm and 4.00pm, by kind permission of Becky at the Bell Inn, I am offering to lead a Lent Group Bible study in The Bell in Walberswick. The group is open to anybody that would like to join. We will be using a five week study booklet called "The York Course", and this year the theme is "Praise Him".

St Andrews Walberswick News

IMPROVEMENTS IN TRAFFIC MANAGE-MENT FOR WALBERSWICK CAR PARKS Over the last few summers, the Car Parks have become increasingly busy. On occasion, this has caused major traffic jams at Cliff Field, as cars are trying to enter and exit at the same time - with some users reporting that they have been unable to exit for over ten minutes. The Car Park Attendants find it very difficult to manage this situation as they are restricted to staying near the huts to collect money and look after the money already in the kitty. They also find it difficult to intervene and manage drivers who are frustrated and angry and sometimes quite aggressive. In busy times, the Ferry Road Car Park can also have problems, with cars backed up the road, as the attendants struggle to take the money at the entrance. These delays can be particularly frustrating if you are a local resident enjoying a day at the beach and you just want to nip back home to pick something up. To gather ideas on how to improve the traffic management, the Directors of WCPL have undertaken a review of neighbouring car parks, particularly the car park at Orford which is run by Orford Town Trust. We have also consulted traffic engineers Mervyn Lambert.

As a result, for the 2017 season we are proposing to introduce the following changes.

1.In the busy spring and summer months, to install two sets of traffic lights on Cliff Field, either side of the bridge, to manage the cars entering and exiting. The lights will work on motion sensors and will be activated as cars approach the bridge.

2. To install solar powered pay machines in both car parks. This will give the attendants more time to manage the traffic and assist drivers by directing them to vacant spots.

Residents will still be issued with permits and be able to park for free as will any driver with a disabled parking permit.

We believe that these changes will result in smoother and safer operation of the car parks and hopefully, easier and less stressful visits to the beach for local residents. When it's 22 degrees outside, inside a car it can reach an unbearable 47 degrees, within the hour. Opening a few inches of window makes no difference. If you see a dog, in distress, in a hot car, dial 999. The police are always willing to contact the owner or attend, if the dog is in distress.

- A Tribute to Tony Lancaster 6th May 2017: With full cloud cover and a biting cold north-easterly wind, the weather did not live up to my expectations. However in excess of 50 souls braved the elements – I only wished that the weather had been kinder. I was, and Tony would have been, very honoured at the turnout including people from Reydon (our youngest participant Sonny), Halesworth and Wickham Market - all of whom had to get up earlier than most. On the way to Hoist Covert, a bat – possibly the common pipistrelle - gave a brief flypast before most of us heard the first Nightingale. East Hill gave us the first Whitethroat and Cetti's Warbler. The first Swift (for me) was very pleasing to see. Marsh Harriers gave a very good account of themselves but sadly no Bitterns were heard on this walk. Bearded Tits gave their "ping" calls before dashing bullet-like across the top of the reeds and the squeal of a water rail was briefly heard above the wind. Some shivering 48 species were seen or heard - not as many as the best of years but better than some. In addition, 3 Red Deer were seen disappearing into the marsh and the Manx Langtans, (a rare breed of sheep from the Isle of Man) dashed past. We were not alone in our frustration as sadly the RSPB Minsmere walk did not fare any better, starting in silence and missing some of their expected star species. A hearty breakfast in The Anchor warmed the assembled group and then the sun came out. I would like to thank everyone for making the morning very special for me and a very generous "goodly" sum was raised towards "Tony's Hide" for which I am extremely grateful. Thank you all. 



LETTER FROM THE OLM (retired)

Dear Friends,

As I write this letter, it feels as though summer has at last arrived. That reminds me how blessed we are to live in such a lovely part of God's creation, with the countryside and seashore so readily available, for our relaxation and enjoyment.

Then I am brought down to earth, as I reflect upon some of the appalling events that have taken place in our country, in recent weeks; the terrorist attacks in Manchester and London and the terrible fire in the block of tower rise flats in West London. That, in turn, leads me to think about and pray for all the people who have been victims of those events; those who have died, those who have been injured and/or traumatised by what has happened to them, or by what they have seen, those who have been bereaved. At the same time we have seen the courage of those within the emergency services, as well as individuals who have willingly tried to assist those who badly needed help and a compassionate shoulder to lean on.

Whilst the events referred to above make us doubly thankful for our life here in Walberswick, I would suggest that we individually and as a community should draw aside from time to time to remember and think about those less fortunate than ourselves –I wonder if we should have arranged to stand together for the one minute's silence, that was held across our nation to remember the victims of the two terrorist attacks?

You may have wanted to remember such occasions on your own. Don't forget that our parish church is always open during the hours of daylight for anyone who wishes to spend quiet time alone, praying and remembering victims of violence and accident. May God bless, as you consider these things.

BLYTH ESTUARY GROUP

Walberswick has three representatives on the Blyth Estuary Group; Richard Steward, John Nichols and myself. The group represents Parish Councils, landowners adjoining the estuary and harbour users. Its objective is to maintain viability of the estuary and harbour by strengthening flood defences. It is not a protest group but instead aims to engage constructively with central and local government.

From Walberswick's perspective there are two priorities; (i) raising and strengthening the bank from the Ferry Hut to the Bailey Bridge and (ii) a new flood gate across Ferry Road linked into the re-built bank by Old Vicarage Cottage. The latter to reduce flood risk to adjoining properties and The Lea.

In order to raise public awareness of flood risk, signs showing past flood heights are now on one of the fishing huts by the Ferry. In addition we will be installing a people counter on the Bailey Bridge footpath to demonstrate the importance of this route to the economy of our Village. This data will support the case for public funding. **James Darkins**, Vice Chairman

Stillness and quiet are precious commodities in a busy world, and we all need the opportunity to be still.

I have recently enjoyed a retreat on the island of Iona in Scotland where the moods of the sea and sky, the absence of modern technology demanding my attention, the hills and views of Scotland's west coast all provided the opportunity to be refreshed and renewed in body and spirit.





LETTER FROM THE OLM (Retired)

Dear Friends,

An explosion on a London Tube train at Parson's Green; North Korea firing rocket missiles over Japan; A middle aged man wounding and killing indiscrimately, those attending a Country & Western Festival, in Las Vegas; More and more refugees adding to the millions already driven from their homes through fear of violence. It has all made me stop to consider how much 'bad' news we hear and read about week after week, not only of events in our own country but around the world. As Christians we are encouraged, constantly, to pray for peace, not only in the lives of individuals but for the world in general. In the Old Testament of the Christian Bible we read about the prophet Jeremiah, who, to put it mildly, was given a rough time by his fellow countrymen because they just could not accept that he had been tasked by God to challenge what was going on in their nation. At one stage he proclaims that people are saying, 'Peace, peace, when there is no peace', and that is how it felt to me until I remembered the words of St Paul in his letter to the young church at Philippi, 'the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding will keep your hearts and your minds in Jesus Christ'. At the time that he wrote those words, Paul was a prisoner in Rome facing execution.

Then I remember something else that Paul wrote, this time to the church at Ephesus i.e. that we ought to give thanks to God at all times, so here are some 'thank yous' on behalf of St Andrew's. Thank you to all those who worked so hard to make our annual village fete such a success; thank you to Denis King, Dave Olney, Gary Kettel & Sarah Eyden for making the recent concert in the church ruins a great time for so many people The monies raised by these two events will be well used in the future work of our parish church.


