

CAR PARK WINTER CHARGING.

As many villagers are aware, charging visitors in the car parks has continued into the winter season, on a pilot basis. Parking for residents remains free. This decision was taken by the Board of Walberswick Car Parks Ltd (WCPL) in order to increase the contribution to the Common Lands Charity to support good causes for the Village. The extra income also helps offset the costs paid all year round, including business rates of £1,435 a month & insurance. From 1 October 2017 to 8 January 2018 the takings were £11,605.

Some residents have told us that they are concerned that winter charging will increase on-street parking, particularly around the Green. Others have suggested a lower rate would be better for shorter visits. In response to these concerns, and our experience to date, we are adding a new option to the Pay & Display of one hour parking for just £1. We are working with our supplier of the machines to get this in place as quickly as possible. However, they have informed us that it could take up to six weeks. We propose to keep this option all year and we hope it will be a positive change. In addition, at the suggestion of the Charity, an integrated Parking and Traffic review for the village is to be undertaken. The purpose is to better understand the larger impact of visitor traffic in the Village, and to look at what options may be best able to manage this. The WCPL Directors will be working alongside the Charity and the Parish Council on this review. We continue to welcome your views and ideas as we move forward. We will assess the pilot winter scheme in spring 2018 and will share the results of this assessment with you.

TRAFFIC & PARKING REVIEW

At the suggestion of the Common Lands Charity, the Parish Council and Walberswick Car Parks have agreed to work together on an integrated traffic and parking review for Walberswick. As part of this review, there will be full consultation with the Village. However in the first instance we are hoping that there maybe someone in the Village who has professional expertise in this area and who would be willing to join the review team? COMMON LANDS CHARITY

In December, the Trustees made their grant allocations for 2018, totalling over £48,000, which they understand is a record amount. This includes £5,000 to the various state schools attended by 25 children from the Village. The Trustees believe this is the highest number of young people supported in many years. In 2017 our largest donation, of over £11,000 was once again to the Sole Bay Care Fund (SBCF). This funded all in-home healthcare provided by SBCF to villagers, during the year, including end of life care, enabling residents to see out their days in their own home. However from 1 January the NHS changed how in-home healthcare is managed and funded in South Waveney. In part, to end what it calls the 'inequality' caused by high levels of service from the Sole Bay Health Centre and SBCF. Along with Councillor Jane Sutherland-Rogers, we met with the Practice Manager and SBCF to learn what this could mean for Walberswick. Certainly, further support from SBCF will be required to fill the gap left by the NHS. The Charity will assist SBCF where possible, but if you are thinking of charitable giving, the SBCF (charity no 1144108) is well worth consideration.

LETTER FROM ... REV'D CANON HARRY EDWARDS

On February 14th a rare occurrence will take place. St.Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday will fall on the same day. The last time that happened was in 1945, and before that 1932,1923, and earlier, you have to go back to 1888, a leap year.

But we won't have to wait too long before this happens again, in 2029.

What (if anything) do these two days in the Christian calendar have in common? I venture to say that it is the word 'love.', but love on two sides of the same coin. St.Valentine's day on February 14th celebrates St.Valentine of Rome, a priest in Rome who was martyred in 269. According to legend, he was imprisoned for ministering to Christians, who were persecuted under the Roman Empire, and during his imprisonment, healed the daughter of his jailer Asterius. Before his execution he wrote a letter to the daughter signed 'your Valentine' as a farewell.

OR...Valentine's day was thought to have originated from the Roman festival of Lupercalia in the middle of February, officially the start of their springtime. It's thought that,, as part of that celebration boys drew girls' names from a box and then courted them.

OR...The celebration of Valentine's day did not have any romantic connections until Chaucer's poem mentioned Valentine, in the 14th century.

But whatever its origins, Valentine's day is a celebration of love, when we send greetings and gifts to a loved one. And what of Ash Wednesday? Ash Wednesday is always on a Wednesday, 7 weeks prior to Easter Sunday, and the day after Mardi Gras. For Christians, the day marks the first day of Lent, and the starting of six weeks of fasting and penitence. Ash Wednesday can also be seen as an act of love....the beginning of the hard love which led Jesus to a cross and suffering. Lent is about the price of love, about the depths of suffering love. It points to the joy of resurrection.

So there you have it. Valentine's day about joy, longing and connection, and on the other side of the coin, Ash Wednesday has as its theme suffering, loss and the longing for new life.

Another rare date. Easter Day and All Fools Day coincide this year on April 1st.

LETTER FROM THE REV'D CANON

Lent

It is probable that the word "Lent" derives from an Anglo Saxon word "lencten" which means "Spring time". The church season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. This year 14th February, and lasts until Easter on 1st April. That is 40 days (excluding Sundays) that remind us of the Biblical story of Christ in the wilderness. Before his ministry in Galilee began, he spent 40 days wrestling and resisting the temptations that might have derailed him. Christians seek to use the season of Lent to draw closer to Christ and to deepen our relationship with him. The tradition of giving something up in Lent is a reminder in our culture, that Lent has been, for centuries, a period of fasting and prayer, of living more simply, in order to be less focussed on self and comfort and more focussed on Christ. For that reason Lent can seem rather bleak. There are no flowers in church for example, and with the lingering days of winter, it can seem cold and drab. However, if Lent means Spring time, that might put a different

Spring is my favourite season. The days become longer and the sun becomes brighter. The gardens, fields and hedgerows begin to waken from their winter slumber. It is less cold in our big medieval churches where the heating is lacking. The sunlight streaming through the high windows brings a fresh brightness, the promise of new life and healed creation. Soon I will be able to wear one or two jumpers on a Sunday morning, rather than three, in order to stay warm!

Spring time is a season of renewal, fresh brightness, new life and the promise of summer to come. We can feel that change in our bodies, emotions and mental well being. We can then, naturally, feel that change in our spiritual well being. Lent is not intended as a harsh and difficult season, but rather as a season of renewal. What we give up or take up, are things that might help us feel closer to Christ and to allow his warmth to cheer us.

LETTER FROM THE OLM (retired)

I guess by the time the current copy of Village News drops through your letter or post box, Easter will be nearly upon us. I wonder what thoughts would be in your mind when Easter is mentioned? Easter eggs, Easter bunnies, Easter egg hunts? Or will you give a moment's thought to the fact that Easter is the major Christian festival?

To jog your memory as to what the festival is really about, I would like to quote below words written by a Dutch Catholic priest, Henri Nouwen, the kind of thoughts that have been much in my mind in recent weeks whilst preparing to preside at funeral and thanksgiving services, of friends, in the village.

"The friends of Jesus saw him and heard him only a few times after that Easter morning, but their lives were completely changed. What seemed to be the end, proved to be the beginning; what seemed to be a cause for fear, proved to be a cause for courage; what seemed to be defeat, proved to be victory; and what seemed to be the basis for despair, proved to be the basis for hope. Suddenly, a wall becomes a gate, and although we are not able to say with much clarity or precision what lies beyond the gate, the tone of all that we do and say, on our way to the gate, changes drastically"

Perhaps I should have called the above, Thought for Easter! I hope that you will enjoy a happy Easter and that you will give some thought to what this period of our Christian faith is really all about

LETTER FROM REV'D CANON

On May 19th,Prince Harry will marry Ms Meghan Markle. We wish them every happiness. The ceremony will take place in St George's Chapel at Windsor Castle. The Archbishop of Canterbury will preside. In recent months, the Archbishop has prepared Ms Markle for baptism and confirmation, within the Church of England, describing her faith as genuine and sincere. 

Dear Friends,

You will see an announcement on this page that on **Sunday** 15th July at St Andrew's Walberswick we are holding an open air celebration service in the ruins of the church, at 11.30am. The service marks the completion of a conservation project that has stabilised the ruins, ensuring that the fragile stonework is safe. It is a major liability on a small PCC to be responsible for extensive ancient ruins, and we are grateful to Historic England for the grant support.

When first built St Andrew's Walberswick was the same size as St Edmund's Southwold and Holy Trinity Blythburgh. Simon Jenkins writes that once it was a "mighty galleon" of a church. It was built during the second half of the fifteenth century, reflecting the confidence in late medieval religion and the wealth of East Anglia. By 1696 however times had changed and the mighty structure must have been in a state of decay. It was too big for the small congregation, who decided to downsize. The church was unroofed, and the smaller church we see today was built within the shell of the earlier south aisle. I wonder how the church members felt when they took that decision? Were they saddened at an apparent decay in church life, or heartened by escaping a major liability? They took a brave and controversial decision. Could any of us imagine tackling such a decision today?

The churchwardens of 1696 would be astonished to know that in 2017, state funding would conserve the ruins of the church that they had abandoned, and that the community was to gather in celebration of those ruins. I like to imagine that they would be thrilled, and that they would praise God for his faithfulness in every generation.

In the hymn, "Abide with me" is the line, "change and decay in all around I see, but thou who changeth not abide in me." What might be perceived in human terms as change, decline and decay is, from God's perspective, part of the ongoing story of his church. That is a story of change, adaption, renewal, new growth and new life. Christ died, was buried, but rose again to new life. In each generation of the church the same pattern is followed.

The church family gives of itself in seeking to serve Christ in its own time and place. That might look very different to what happened in the past, but is obedient to Christ's call today. Tomorrow new life will grow from what is done today, and the life of the church continues in each generation.

I hope and pray that Sunday 15th July will be a happy, sunny day in Walberswick, a first day in God's new tomorrow.







LALBERSWICH TO THE STATE OF THE

BAILEY BRIDGE CLOSURE—UPDATE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

The abrupt closure of the Bailey Bridge has been a terrible shock to our community. The WPC wrote this summary to fill in some missing information. Please see the News section of the Walberswick website for the full WPC article.

What happened? The Bridge was closed by Suffolk Highways (SH) and Suffolk County Council (SCC) on 3rd October, without any consultation or warning. This was immediately condemned by the WPC, with support from District Councillor Michael Gower and Waveney Councillor, David Beavan. As word spread, others expressed their dismay to Highways and the Council. SCC then agreed to subsidise the running of the Rowing Ferry for an initial 2 weeks. Dani and her crew have been amazing in providing service from 9 to 5.30 each day. They have been carrying some 400+ to 500+ passengers daily.

The WPC arranged for Cllr Richard Smith to attend the WPC meeting on Monday, 8 October to answer questions. SH and SCC also arranged to have a meeting on 10 October with the local authorities (district Councillors, WPC Chairman, Southwold Mayor, Harbour Master, Reydon/Blyth Estuary and other key stakeholders). The press release that was prepared, following the meeting, is posted on the Walberswick website. Why was the bridge closed? Engineering consultants did an inspection of the bridge in September. We were told that Suffolk has done other inspections – including one in 2015, on which no action was taken, evidence of corrosion. The 3 page précis from AECOM warned of two dangers. The first was the possibility of the deck plates shifting, as a result of corrosion of beams under the plates. The second related to a long-broken wooden cross beam and bolt structure that could impact the bridge's stability in certain conditions. SH confirmed that the bridge was not in imminent danger of collapsing or tipping someone into the river, but that the potential danger of the shifting deck plates was enough to warrant the closure until the fuller analysis was done. It was agreed that the engineer's report should be expedited and Highways committed to a 2-3 week time scale. What can be done? It is likely that there are sensible, relatively quick solutions to the safety issues identified. We are urging Suffolk authorities to make use of local knowledge of the bridge and the river, including locally based engineers and builders. Whether they will accept such solutions will become clearer when the group meets again in about 2 weeks.

The meetings have brought some progress. There is additional commitment to support the Ferry for at least an additional 2 weeks. We believe the Ferry must run as a stop-gap until the bridge is reopened. SCC also agreed to help people with exceptional problems in getting across the river.

<u>Please see the Press Release for full details.</u> They also committed to "consider all possible remedial solutions for the bridge, whether temporary, interim or long-term." Locally, we are united on what must happen — nothing can substitute for the Bridge and this vital artery must be fixed and reopened quickly.

LETTER FROM THE REVEREND CANON

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the armistice, at the end of the First World War. At 11 o clock on the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918 the guns fell silent, and four long years of misery, suffering and death, on the western front, came to an end. This year. Remembrance Day falls on Sunday 11th November, and on this day our church services will remember those who served, those who fell in war, and those who were bereaved 100 years ago.

This year, the Remembrance Day service will be in Holy Trinity Blythburgh at 10.50. Writing in November 1918 in the parish magazine in Southwold, the Revd Claude Hope Sutton quoted from Psalm 126 verse 3 "the Lord has done great things for us, whereof we are glad." He wrote "great things carry with them a sense of awe and solemnity. This is especially so when the "great things" are such as will influence for good, generations yet unborn, and countless multitudes in the next few years, also, all over the face of the globe. God "who only doeth wondrous things" has done more for us in the past few weeks than any of us could have possibly expected."

His words convey a sense of relief and thanksgiving that the war had ended, and a sense of hope for a better world for future generations. Those sentiments we can share. There is much to give thanks for today, not least the gift of peace. There is much to pray about, if we are to bequeath a better world for future generations.
