Walberswick Common Lands Charity

Winter works on the heathland have commenced. To the north of the heath is a rare transition zone of wet heath before the fen, which is where the vegetation (reed and scrub) is currently being cut by hand. Heathlands are intrinsically dry landscapes, based on sandy and acid soils. They support specialist species that can tolerate the acid conditions. Because sand is so permeable, it also means that the small amount of wetland that does occur on heathlands, is rarer, and has proportionately even more value than it would have in an otherwise 'wet' landscape.

A key species to look out for in this transition zone is Erica tetralix, cross-leaved heath, a type of heather that likes bogs, heathland and moorland. It has distinctive pink, bell-shaped flowers that attract all kinds of nectar-loving insects. Stewardship in this area is focused on scrub management and reed cutting to increase species diversity. It is the first time for many years that the reeds in the fen have been cut.

LionLink

It was with great dismay that we learnt on 17 February of National Grid Ventures Ltd's (NGV) decision to name Walberswick's Manor Field as its "preferred location" for LionLink. This decision was taken despite the thousands of objections and evidence shared by the Walberswick community along with the County, District, and Parish Councils that pointed out the serious environmental and human health impacts, as well as the economic harm associated with the Manor Field location. The fact that NGV's "alternative" was a Southwold location, which would also suffer from these impacts, further supports the overwhelming public response to LionLink that an off-shore grid, with a brownfield landing site nearer to where the power is needed, would be the proper alternative.

This decision by NGV brings us to a new point in the overall process, but in no way makes this ill-conceived development a certainty. NGV's preferred timeline is set out in the flyer recently delivered to homes in the village. It will be holding a drop-in session in the Village Hall on 15 March. We strongly encourage all residents to attend, ask questions, and express your views. During this next phase, Walberswick Parish Council (WPC) will be working closely with Walberswick Against LionLink (WALL), the County and District Councils, and other partners, to highlight how inappropriate LionLink is in this location, and what mitigation (if such a thing is possible) would be required to address the myriad associated environmental, human health, and economic impacts. WPC will also endeavour to keep people informed of the process and what they can do to express their views. Towards this end, WPC will look to have a public meeting a few weeks after the 15 March drop-in, to update on timelines, the processes involved, and hopefully provide an opportunity for our community to exchange views with our government representatives. More on this to come.

Devolution

Many of you will already be aware that Suffolk has been put into the 'fast track' for devolution, meaning that many responsibilities for delivery of District/County services will change hands and a new mayoral area covering both Norfolk and Suffolk is likely to be introduced. There are scant details at present, and WPC will keep you updated as we find out more

Southwold Half Marathon


