- 14. Garlic three bulbs

- 16. Lettuce two (same type)
- 17. Tomatoes three single (calyx still attached)
- 18. Tomatoes Cherry Type five single- 3cm max (calyx still attached)
- 19. Courgettes three (10-15 cm)
- 20. Mixed Herbs a tied bunch of five varieties, non-flowering (please label)
- 21. Rhubarb three sticks as pulled (leaves reduced to 2 inches)
