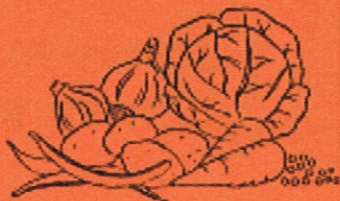

FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

The following should be shown on a white paper plate (available on the day)

1. **Potatoes** - five (same variety)
2. **Peas** - five pods (same variety)
3. **Broad Beans** - five pods
4. **French Beans** - five pods
5. **Runner Beans** - five pods
6. **Spinach** - five leaves
7. **Carrots** - five (leaves trimmed)
8. **Beetroot** - three (leaves trimmed)
9. **Cucumber** - one (any variety)
10. **Onions** - three (not skinned, tops tied)
11. **Shallots** - seven (separate, not skinned,
12. **Spring Onions** - three
13. **Radish** - five (leaves trimmed)
14. **Garlic** - three bulbs
15. **Chilli Peppers** - three (same type)
16. **Lettuce** - two (same type)
17. **Tomatoes** - three single (calyx still attached)
18. **Tomatoes Cherry Type** - five single- 3cm max (calyx still attached)
19. **Courgettes** - three (10-15 cm)
20. **Mixed Herbs** - a tied bunch of five varieties, non-flowering (please label)
21. **Rhubarb** - three sticks as pulled (leaves reduced to 2 inches)
22. **Novelty** - one odd shaped fruit or vegetable
23. **Gooseberries** - seven (with stalks on)
24. **Redcurrants or Whitecurrants** - seven strings
25. **Raspberries** - seven (with stalks on)
26. **Blueberries** - seven (with stalks on)
27. **Any other soft fruit not included above** - three
28. **Any other vegetable not included above** - one or two specimens



HARVEY MEMORIAL TROPHY

Decorative presentation of own grown mixed produce

Maximum 7 varieties (inclusive of decoration)

FLOWERS

- 29. **Pinks** - five sprays
- 30. **Roses (Hybrid tea)** - three blooms
- 31. **Roses (Floribunda)** - three sprays (one or more variety)
- 32. **Agapanthus** - three stems (one or more variety)
- 33. **Sweet Peas** - nine stems (without decorative foliage)
- 34. **Annuals** - five stems (one or more varieties)
- 35. **Hardy Perennials** - five stems (one or more varieties)
- 36. **Flowering Shrubs** - five stems (one or more varieties)
- 37. **Hydrangeas** - three stems (one or more varieties)
- 38. **Pot Plant** - one, any kind: flowering in max. 23cm internal dia. pot
- 39. **Pot Plant** - one, any kind: foliage
- 40. **Cactus or Succulent** - one pot or pan
- 41. **Pelargonium** - one pot (regal or zonal)
- 42. **Orchid** - one pot
- 43. **Exotic flowering plant** - one pot

Dahlias - five blooms (one or more colours) no buds

- 67. An arrangement of foliage in a vase - not exceeding 61cm high
- 68. Flower arrangement in an unusual container by a man
- 69. Buttonhole

JUNIOR CLASSES - 12 and under

(Open to Visitors)

Children's exhibits should have minimal help from adults, and be individual entries. Please put name and age on Exhibit.

- 70. Drawing of a flower (under 7 years old)
- 71. Drawing of a flower (8-12 years old)
- 72. Any fruit or vegetable grown by a child (all ages)
- 73. Flower arrangement by a child (all ages) Bought flowers acceptable
