Report from The Street

The village's trained volunteer Community Speed Watch team continues to turn up a couple of times a month, even in the freezing winter months, to remind motorists of the 20mph speed limit in the village. Obviously, this doesn't always work, despite the traffic signs and the Speed Indicator Devices.

The team records the registration numbers of vehicles breaking the speed limit, which are sent to the police for further action. In the first quarter of this year, the police sent out 32 letters to people exceeding the speed limit coming into and leaving the village, and a second letter to a further five people, who had already been sent a first letter. No action, other than the letter, is taken after a first incident. A warning is issued with a second letter. Persistent offenders have their vehicle details passed on to the relevant team at Suffolk Constabulary and may receive targeted intervention or a visit.

collection service

Sadly, the collection of prescriptions by village volunteers from the Sole Bay Health Centre for pick-up at the Tuck Shop has been discontinued by our medical practice. Unfortunately, the process does not conform to the Care Quality Commission's high standards relating to the storage of medication in a temperature-controlled setting. Patient confidentiality is also an issue under Data Protection rules.

However, family members or friends can be authorised to collect medication from the Health Centre upon completion of a consent form. This information will be entered on the patient's computer record and checked before any prescriptions are handed over. Another option is to ask the Health Centre to send a prescription to an online pharmacy, many of which will then send it, free of charge (unless a prescription fee is required), via the tracked postal service.

Our sincerest thanks to the many organisers and volunteers who made the collection service possible for so many years. It will be sorely missed. Editor

Walberswick Wildlife Survey Phase 2

As part of its ongoing campaign against LionLink, WALL detectors and surveys will be collated and used to argue (Walberswick Against LionLink) is about to embark on against LionLink's suggestion that bringing the LionLink Phase 2 of the Walberswick Wildlife Watch survey. WALL has purchased six birdsong meters that WALL volunteers will be deploying at various key locations around the marshes adjacent to the landfall site, as well as the cable corridor to the west of the village, along with a number of bat detectors and wildlife cameras. If you see any of these, please do not interfere with them. In addition, WALL is considering commissioning professional surveyors to conduct specific surveys on birds and invertebrates. WALL continues to log pedestrian use of the footpaths around the proposed landfall site but sadly one of the pedestrian footfall counters that WALL had installed near Manor Field was again vandalised last month. However, it will be replaced shortly. WALL will not be deterred by wanton vandalism - whoever the culprit! The data from all these



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interconnector ashore in Walberswick will have no adverse impact on wildlife habitats or the community.

We would also urge all residents to improve their knowledge of local birdlife by downloading the Merlin bird identification app, merlin.allaboutbirds.org. When you are out and about, anywhere around Walberswick, and hear or see birds such as marsh harriers, bearded tits, nightjars, woodlarks, bitterns or others, you can easily log these sightings on another app called iRecord, irecord.org.uk. This database collates all wildlife sightings and we will be drawing on the data it contains in our campaign.
