Dick hangs up his tools

After more than 25 years of volunteering at the Alfred Corry Lifeboat Museum in Southwold, lifelong resident of Walberswick, 91-year-old Dick Leon has finally decided to hang up his tools. A highly skilled and respected carpenter, Dick helped restore the lifeboat that served the town for 25 years from 1893 to 1918. The old Cromer lifeboat shed that now houses the Alfred Corry has also hugely benefited from Dick's skills.

John Craigie, the great grandson of the lifeboat's first coxswain, purchased the derelict Alfred Corry in 1974 and restored it, subsequently enjoying several cruises with his friend, Dick, whom he first met in the Sea Scouts. When maintenance became too difficult, the lifeboat was donated by the Craigie family to Southwold in 1994.

Dick's achievements were celebrated with a special ceremony at the museum when he was presented with a picture of the lifeboat. Environmental update

Walking to the coast on the footpath from Spong Bridge the state of the salt marsh becomes clear; it is bone dry. Unusual weather saw East Anglia having the highest amount of March sunshine on record, particularly in Norfolk and Suffolk. For example, Wattisham in Suffolk recorded over 220 hours of sunshine, exceeding the previous record by over 22 hours. With an average of 228.9 hours of sunshine across the month, the UK has also recorded its sunniest April since records began in 1910. The combined East Anglia rainfall for March and April 2025 was 28mm, which is the fifth driest March to April rainfall total for East Anglia based on records going back to 1871.

Fascinating data, and nature is incredibly resilient but please think twice about any form of burning - and keep your fingers crossed for more rain.

Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

The meeting was held on Monday, 12 May and Andrew Lewis was elected unopposed to be Chair of the Parish Council for the next year and Rebecca Whiting was elected unopposed to be Vice-Chair of the Council for the next year.

Local Government reorganisation and creation of a mayoral authority in Norfolk and Suffolk

A lot of work is currently underway to finalise the creation of a mayoral authority that almost certainly will cover the whole of Norfolk & Suffolk, along with the creation of one or more Unitary Authorities that will ultimately take over much of the work currently being done in Suffolk County Council and East Suffolk District Council; these bodies are very likely to disappear as part of this process. Currently the County Council and the District Councils have differing views on the most desirable number of Unitary Authorities and representations from both are being submitted to the National Government, which will have the final say. The

Parish Council will keep you informed on the impact the final proposals are likely to have on the provision of services in Walberswick over the months to come. The most likely date for mayoral elections is considered to be May 2026.

Public Meeting on Energy Projects along the Heritage Coast

WALL invertebrate surveys

WALL (Walberswick Against LionLink) has commissioned a series of invertebrate surveys to be undertaken monthly between May and September by specialist entomologists, Chris Bentley and Andy Musgrove. Surveys will focus on the marshes below Manor Field, and the grassland around East Sheep Walk. They have set pitfall traps, between visits, to sample ground-dwelling beetles, which have surface

We won't have detailed results until later in the year, but on his first visit Chris recorded a rare soldier fly (Stratiomys longicornis), which is a saline pool specialist restricted to the Suffolk/Norfolk coast. Any rare invertebrates may be impacted by the proposed drilling under these areas, so it is important we know what is there to counter the LionLink Environmental Impact Assessment.
