When the Co-op put the Tuck Shop up for sale, there was huge concern among residents, both for the shop and for the staff who run it. Now the freehold has been secured, Emma and Richard will be renting the property, at a peppercorn rate, to two local shopkeepers, Ben and Gaia Woolnough, a young, enthusiastic husband and wife team from Reydon. For the last eight years, Ben has run Bridgefoot Stores in Reydon, the brilliant well-stocked, eco-friendly shop that really does cater for the local community. We are hoping he and Gaia can create similar magic in Walberswick.

Ben and Gaia have ambitious plans to gradually grow the Tuck Shop into a sustainable, independent, communityfocused shop that will thrive in partnership with the village. They plan to stock a carefully chosen range of products that will work for all customers, while focusing on eco-friendly practices. We can look forward to good affordable essentials, well-priced snacks and beverages, and quality fresh produce from trusted suppliers of fruit, vegetables, meat, fish, wine, pies and more. Their vision is for a more attractive, greener shop with more communal space for meeting and chatting, all while still respecting the activities of the deli, village pubs and tearooms. They will also be looking at ways to give back to the community. Ben and Gaia are committed to working with the existing staff to meet the village's needs, and plan to regularly consult customers on stock, services, and priorities.



A blue plaque for Charles Rennie Mackintosh

The story of Charles Rennie Mackintosh's stay in Walberswick has been well documented and now we have a blue plaque to mark the event. According to *Walberswick, People and Houses 1870-1930* by Edward Wright, in July 1914 the Mackintoshes took a room for the summer at Millside, a guest house, as well as a studio at the harbour. Millside is where the blue plaque is located. War broke out not long after their arrival but the Mackintoshes decided to continue their stay in the village. They moved out of Millside, probably staying briefly at The Blue Anchor before moving to Westwood in Lodge Road. It was here that Mackintosh was famously arrested one evening in June 1915 on false suspicions of spying for the enemy. Following the intervention of well-placed friends, he was released provided he kept away from Norfolk, Suffolk and Essex for the rest of the hostilities.

gmail.com @littlewoodenhut walberswick seen from Wally's Bridge. Suffolk Wildlife Trust is helping trustees to look more closely at this ecosystem, especially the vegetation. It mostly looks brown and muddy from the bridge, but on closer inspection, sea lavender, samphire and thrift were amongst the plants which were recorded. Saltmarshes are usually restricted to comparatively sheltered locations in five main physiographic situations: in estuaries, in saline lagoons, behind barrier islands, at the heads of sea lochs, and on beach plains. The development of saltmarsh vegetation is dependent on the presence of intertidal mudflats.

WCLC's focus is to "Maintain coastal saltmarsh in good condition and restore saltmarsh in unfavourable condition where vegetation management is a key factor." It is a site where the best management is low intervention. One thing anyone can do is to avoid disturbance of the site, and reflect on the moon, sun and tides creating conditions in which these plants have developed a variety of tolerance levels to salt, resulting in a mosaic of flora and fauna. Amazing!
